She is semi-retired, and serves as Secretary of the Central PA LGBT Center's Board of Directors. She has co-authored a Practice Guide on PA DUI law, and works with the Pennsylvania Department of Corrections facilitating a monthly teleconference support group for transgender inmates.

She has also announced at the Women's Flat Track Derby Association (WFTDA) international playoffs since 2011.
