Theotis W. Braddy graduated from Temple University with a Master's degree in Social Work in 1988. He also attended Edinboro University and received his Bachelor of Science degree in Social Work.

At the early age of 15, he became a person with a disability due to a high school football accident. For over 25 years, Mr. Braddy has advocated on behalf of persons with disabilities. He was hired in 1988 to establish and administer the Center for Independent Living of Central Pennsylvania (CILCP). As CEO, Mr. Braddy has created an independent living center that has become a strong and growing voice for persons with disabilities.

Mr. Braddy has taught at Temple University as an Adjunct Professor teaching Social Welfare Policy I & II for students seeking their Master's Degree in Social Work at the Temple University Harrisburg Campus. He currently serves as an Adjunct Professor at Millersville University teaching courses in Discrimination and Oppression of Persons with Disabilities.

Mr. Braddy serves on a number of boards and committees. He has been appointed by three different Governors to serve as a Commissioner for the Pennsylvania Human Relation Commission. Mr. Braddy has been appointed by Governor Corbett to the PA Statewide Independent Living Council.

Mr. Braddy works diligently towards ensuring that the Americans with Disabilities Act is fully implemented to allow for full participation of all citizens with disabilities. In addition to his continued commitment and service as CEO of the [Center for Independent Living of Central PA \(CILCP\)](#), he is the Visionary behind Living Well with a Disability.
