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Tucked Discreetly Off the Beaten Track, Le Parc Suites Hotel in West Hollywood is a Delightful Refuge Right in the Middle of it All

Already relaxed by the serene elegance at the entrance of the Parc Hotel in West Hollywood, the arrival of Dolly Parton the same day only reinforced my initial impression that mine was going to be an enjoyable stay. Despite being surrounded by the usual bustle of Hollywood and the fact that the hotel warmly welcomes your pets, one is relaxed by the decor's warm colors and the attentive, diplomatic attention and respect for privacy paid by the staff.



Another welcome feature is the complimentary house car valet service if you need to get somewhere within a few miles of the hotel. I had an appointment at a movie set and an affable fellow named Mario took me in the car pictured here. One reason I comment on this is that it's nice to know you can get somewhere quickly if you've opted not to rent a car, and secondly that Mario was such a kind soul and happy conversationalist!

The hotel has 154 boutique-styled suites that range in size from 650 to 1,000 sq. ft. If you feel like dining in, you're in for a treat with the Knoll restaurant. Seating only 42, the intimate setting is perfect for the informal business meetings Hollywood is known for, and also offers dramatic views from a rooftop terrace. (Skydeck.)



This is a well-priced accommodation choice considering the luxury appointments and proximity to the best of Hollywood, from Rodeo Drive and top nightclubs to the Hollywood Bowl. (Where, incidentally, Dolly was playing!)

Life is sweet for pets here too! To prove it, Le Parc Hotel employs a dog called Jackson Oscar, who leads the pets department. He is endowed with movie star good looks – making him quite photogenic if you choose to stroll the neighborhood with him! One of his jobs is to lay down the rules for animals, including not leaving them unattended, keeping them on a leash at all times when in the hotel outside of your room and paying a one-time \$75 fee for cleaning and upkeep. He's really a hit with guests who come in and want to either pet them or play with the doggies. I'm not sure if Jackson Oscar oversees the hotel's adorable and exclusive Doggie Beer, but if he ends up over-indulging, the broth it's made of could only be nourishing!



There is an adequate gym for those that actually have the time or inclination to stay indoors and exercise while in Hollywood! The Skydeck is a very welcome respite on the third floor that includes a Heated Pool, Spa, Cabanas, a Lighted Tennis Court and a vista of the hills and the new Design Center.



The rooms are so spacious, and a comfortable sleep is guaranteed not just by the excellent mattresses, but by the wonderful pillows that were just the right consistency and thickness for me! Another nice feature was the free high speed wireless Internet service. Keeping with the current style, the rooms are currently being renovated with new carpeting and appliances.
