

Surrenders and Admissions 1320-1420 Wolverhampton

- Ed III 8 ?Amisia Gyfford of Whitemore through Alice her sister her attorney surrender of one place of land called ? the Marshes, one selion lying next to the land in the place of William the Wise in the manor of Codsall to the use of Richard of Scheynton who gave 6s. Pledges Henry Rogers and Richard of Rugge. John of Lapley steward
- Ed III 15
- Edward III. Roger Kyng of Codsall surrender of one place of land in Stocking Lane with ?hedges & a ditch around to the use of John the Miller and Juliana his wife
- Ed III 36. Martin Jurdan of Codsall death, had held land in Codsall. Martin the Dene, Henry the Smyth and William the Wyn took all the land and tenements in which Martin Jurdan was seised and gave to the lord 20s.
Martin the Dene surrendered 3 buttes of land in Wyghtmounur croft, another in Uchestones field and a third in the More field which were formerly Martin's to the use of Christiana and Idonia the daughters of John the Millward & gave 9d to the reeve
The same day Henry the Milleward surrendered half an acre of land in Caldewall field, one ?fycher [small piece perhaps] & half an acre in the More Field, one butte in Caldewall Field and 1 selion in Uchestones field to the use of Christiana and Idonia the daughters of John the Millward & they gave 9d to the bailiff
- Ed III 37 William the Wyn surrender 3 places of land with appurtenances in Codsall 3 places of land with appurtenances called The Rudyngs above the Lychings enclosed with hedges and ditches to the use of Julian the Milleward of Codsall. Gave 3s to John Gamill the reeve. [Mention of Edmund atte Lee steward but was this at an earlier time?]
- Ed III 45 John son of John the Parsons surrender of one messuage and 3 crofts of new land of ... 2 quarters with the reversion of the third part of the tenements which land Walter at Hallegate and Alice his wife held in dote to Alice herself with one acre of land and half ancient land with appurtenances known as Barber's/Barker's Meadow in Codsall to the use of John Wyntur and Idonie his wife. Ingress 6s 8d. John son of John gave a heriot of 6d for the third part of the land. Wit: John of Bobynton
- Rich II 2 Adam Tooby of Willenhall one place of land called Fybersleye and one place called Long Lane in Willenhall to the use of John his son. Fine 3s 4d
- Rich II 4 John Wynter paid for an enquiry of 12 men to determine whether he has the better right in the land of John Parsons after his death when it should happen or John the son of John Parsons & whether the land and holdings should be free to be sold or not. The 12: William Colats, Walter the Kynch, John the Wryche, Adam Bysschop, Thomas Clerk, Henry the Smyth, John Cole, Richard the Chaluner, Nicholas atte Wode, Thomas the Kyng, William son of James and Nicholas the young [photo chopped off so needs checking]
- Rich II 10 John Wynter paid for an enquiry of 12 men to determine ?how the reeve is elected. The 12: Thomas Filleson, William atte Leee, John atte Mershe, Thomas Wilkys, William Mulleward, Henry of Stretton, Hugh Henney, Richard ?Oldeparish?, John ?Spurier, William Moykes, William Palmer & John of Grene. Steward Nicholas Waryng
- Rich II 13 Henry of Stretton and Adam Nayllour/Mayllour surrendered one toft, one old messuage and all the lands with appurtenances which they had from the surrender of Adam Busschop of Codeshale to the use of Adam Busschop and Agnes the daughter of John Gamell and the heirs of their bodies legitimately procreated. Gave a fine of 2s
- Rich II 22 Thomas Hendsen surrendered 2 places of land with meadows and pasture with appurtenances at Willenhall between a lane called the Broad Lane and the Small Lane on the one side and on the other in length from the land of Richard Leuseon of Willenhall until the land of William of Elmonehill?? to the use of the said William. Half of the place of land with appurtenances he grants to Thomas Hendsen for his life & to revert to William after his death. Robert russell steward
- Henry IV 1 Christiana Mulleward held one selion ... in Codeshale has died. Heriot 6d to ... Wyntur and Idonia his wife [water damaged]
- Henry IV 1 John Lewyn through William Colletts bailiff his attorney surrendered an old messuage with a butte of land adjacent with appurtenances and with a parcel adjacent with its appurtenances in Codeshale next to the land of Adam Busschop to the work of Thomas Lewyn

and having taken it Thomas gave the land to Margery his mother for the term of her life, to revert to Thomas after her death. Fine 6d

- Henry IV 4 Thomas Lewyn through Henry of Stretton surrenders the reversion of the above land which was his mother's to his son Walter
- Henry IV 5 John Wyntur and Itonia, tenants of the lord of one cottage new land and diverse parcels of old land in Codeshale and new with appurtenances in Codeshale has died. Heriot one black ox, hanket (roan, perhaps) and on this came John Michale and Agnes his wife and claimed the property by right of heredity. Fine for the new land 6d and for the old 2s 6d. Richard Colmoner steward
- Henry IV 9 Richard othe Heath surrendered one cottage with curtilage in Wolverhampton in Tunwallstret between the land of Thomas the Weaver on the one side and Walter Heuster on the other to the use of the same Walter and Isabel his wife fine 12d
- Henry IV 10 John Lyleshull through William Reynalds bailiff surrender of cottage with adjacent curtilage & land In Pelshale formerly Thomas Palmer's to the use of William Palmer for the term of his life and then to John his son.

William Palmer then surrenders to William fit Reynalds of Pelshall & Nicholas Aleyn and they then surrender to William Palmer for the term of his life

- Henry IV 11 Felix son of William Carter surrendered all his land with appurtenances in Codsall to the use of John Scheynton of Codeshale & Agnes his wife. Gave for heriot 6d. Clerk of the court Richard Leveson
- Henry IV 15 Richard Leveson, chaplain, surrendered 3 places of land all enclosed with hedges and ditches ?Leucendsbruche, ?Backebruche & Ferneybruche from the surrender of William atte Lee of Graseley to the use of William and Emma his wife
- Henry IV 16 William Waterfall surrender through Richard Leveson surrendered 7 selions with one marler and half ... with appurtenances in the field called Horsehullfield between the land of the prebends of the manor on the one side and the prebends of Wybaston on the other to the use of Henry Waleys

Henry IV 4 William Waterfall surrenders 7 selions in the field of wolverhampton of which 2 are in the Quebbe Field next to the land of Hugh Tandy and 5 as above in Horsehullfield between the land of the prebends of the manor on the one side and the prebends of Wybaston on the other to the use of Henry Waleys

Nicholas atte ?Peek & Roger Leveson surrender 3 selions in Quebbe Field between the land of the prebends of the manor on the one side and the land formerly John Carter of Baggesor on the other to teh use of henry Waleys
