## All about him

It really is all about Jesus, every bit of it. I sometimes teach a class on the Pentateuch—the first five books of the Old Testament—and my top goal in the class is to help my students see that every page we read is about the Christ we confess. It's not "What We Learn From the Flood," or "Abraham, the Leader of his Family," or "Moses: Leadership 101."

It's about Jesus. All of it.

Sometimes in our Bible reading we hurry through the Old Testament so we can get to Jesus in Matthew, but that's a big mistake. We won't even be able to see Jesus in the gospels if we don't see him in Genesis, not really.

Here's one thing Jesus said about the first 39 books of your Bible:

Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 5:17-20).

We often claim to be New Testament Christians—and I understand why—but I think it'd be better to call ourselves Bible Christians. Jesus didn't come to set the Old Testament aside so that we could focus our attention on what's really important—the New Testament.

He came to fulfill it, to show us its ultimate meaning, to help us see him there.

After the resurrection Jesus had an extended conversation with a couple of disciples who were discouraged because they thought he was still dead. Luke gives us a hint about what Jesus taught them: "And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself" (Luke 24:27).

I'd love to have heard that little sermon, but apparently it began in Genesis 1 and finished in Malachi 4. The subject of the sermon?

Jesus himself.

It might be that you haven't spent much time in the first part of your Bible. Maybe you're mostly reading the New Testament—it's good when you're reading any part of the Bible, of course.

But I'd urge you to look again at the earlier books. Try to look past the genealogies and laws and regulations and see if you can find Jesus. You might want to get some kind of reading guide that'll help.

But I guarantee you it'll strengthen your faith. In fact, of all the reasons I believe that Jesus is the Son of God, the strongest one is that I just don't see any way that any group of people could've written everything in the Old Testament that's so beautifully and completely fulfilled in one Person, Jesus Christ.

#### The Reward of Wickedness

So many times I have stated, and heard other preachers state, that the Christian life is not always the easiest. There is a valid reason for this practice . . . Jesus told us that we must each choose between the wide, easy way (life of sin) that leads to destruction, and the narrow, difficult way (path of righteousness) that leads to life. Truly there will be "few who find" that difficult path that leads to everlasting life. There are things, such as self-sacrifice, that make the Christian's life somewhat difficult, but today let's focus on the difficulties of a sinful life.

A "proof text" for this idea could be Proverbs 13:15, which states: "Good understanding giveth favor; but the way of the transgressor is hard." In one of my classes at the local jail in Greenville, the inmates and I spent several minutes listing any sins we could think of. After each newly mentioned sin, we stopped and listed all the ways that each sin could make our lives harder. For every single one, we were able to come up with multiple negative consequences.

Another proverb reads, "Disaster pursues sinners, but the righteous are rewarded with good" (Proverbs 13:21). It is disastrous when adultery enters the sanctity of marriage. It is disastrous when men and women begin even casual use of drugs. It is disastrous when people lie to those around them. We can follow these and all other sins to their logical ends, and we will find disaster most every time. "But the righteous are rewarded with good."

If disaster is pursuing you because of your "treacherous" (ESV) ways, there is a Biblical "escape plan" in place for you. "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. Draw near to God, and He will draw near to you" (James 4:7-8). When you resist the temptations of sin and turn to God, the devil turns and runs, while God draws nearer to you. The path that leads to life is narrow and difficult, but the one who travels that path diligently will reach a glorious, eternal reward (John 14:1-4).
