A most important belief

[Christianity has many beliefs, but none are more important than the resurrection. Here is an excerpt from a good friend's book about this key conviction—Disciples of the Empty Tomb (by Brandon Renfroe). It you want a good, readable book on the Lord's resurrection, grab a copy. This is from chapter 1. —Chuck]

In the pantheon of Bible doctrines, it can be argued that the resurrection of Christ from the dead occupies the chief seat at the theological table. This may seem like a rather bold claim until it is realized that it also encompasses the divinity of Christ (Romans 1:3-4), the salvation of those who accept it (Romans 10:9; 1 Peter 3:21), and the second coming of the Lord to claim those who belong to him (1 Thessalonians 4:14).

Thus, when you read popular works about the resurrection, it is not uncommon to encounter statements like these:

"... the Resurrection is the central event in Christianity ..." (Geisler and Turek, I Don't Have Enough Faith to be An Atheist, p. 301)

"In the war between truth and doubt, nothing outweighs the battle over a certain plot of Jerusalem-area real estate where death moved in on a Friday afternoon and came out the front door big as life on a Sunday morning" (Kostenberger, Bock, and Chatraw, *Truth Matters*, p. 160).

"... if Christ had not been raised from the dead, then nothing else matters: our resurrection, the church, or Christianity ..." (McDowell, Evidence that Demands a Verdict, p. 236).

These comments are valuable, as they show the great esteem in which scholars rightly hold the doctrine of the resurrection. But the judgment of the apostle Paul, to continue our theme of comparative importance, surely trumps them all.

Here's the thing.

Paul agrees.

Notice how he begins his great treatise on the resurrection in 1 Corinthians 15.

Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures . . .

Along with his atoning death, Paul described the resurrection of Christ as being "of first importance." In commenting on this passage, Albert Mohler aptly noted:

"All revealed truth is vital, invaluable, life-changing truth to which every disciple of Christ is fully accountable. But certain truths are of highest importance, and that is the language that Paul uses without qualification" ("Of First Importance: The Cross and Resurrection at the Center," March 29, 2013, albertmohler.com).

This is precisely what we have been saying. Namely, all truth is God's truth, and all of it is valuable. None of it is unimportant. But some truths occupy the top rung, and the resurrection is chief among them . . .



Two Roads

He came to a fork in the road. On one hand there was the road that led up a hill where three crosses stood. On two of the crosses, criminals were to be crucified, but the third cross was reserved for the very Son of God. He knew that it was his betrayal that placed Jesus into the hands of the angry mob. He gazed long and hard down that road, but his remorse and shame caused him to notice the road on his other hand. It was a lonely road, which no one seemed to have traveled that day. Judas chose the lonely road, and as he walked, weeping bitterly, it came to him. He saw the tree, and he knew what he would do. He draped the rope over a large limb, tied it around his neck, and hanged himself.

Meanwhile, up the other road, our suffering Savior bled. He was bound to the cross only by His love for us as the multitude continued deriding Him. Then, He opened His mouth and said, "Father forgive them for they know not what they do." Oh, if only Judas had walked up that road instead! Perhaps he could have fought through the guilt and shame. Maybe, in addition to 1st and 2nd Peter, our New Testament would contain 1st and 2nd Judas as well.

The truth is, Judas was no more wrong than Peter, any one of the hateful men and women who consented to Jesus' death, or you, or me. We've all sinned, and we've all gone astray (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6). But God is willing to save all of us.

God has done His part. *Our responsibility* is to obey the gospel of Jesus Christ (2 Thessalonians 1:8). Paul said that saving message is that Christ died for our sins, was buried, and rose again on the third day (1 Corinthians 15:1-4). Then in Romans 6:3-4, Paul explains how every person can **OBEY** that gospel message. "Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life." You too are guilty . . . which road will you choose?
