#### **Wolves**

Is there any such thing as a false prophet in our world today? If so, what would that person look like?

I find myself thinking of someone with a sinister-looking face and a conniving grin. Other images—probably inspired by ridiculous Hollywood portrayals—come to mind: a devilish character with a forked tongue, faintly visible horns, maybe a pitchfork. In other words, in my mind it doesn't take too long to figure out whose side they're on.

And that's probably why these people are so effective. They never carry pitchforks, and nothing about them makes us think they're doing the devil's bidding.

But Jesus gives us this stern warning:

Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing but inwardly are ravenous wolves. You will recognize them by their fruits. Are grapes gathered from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? So, every healthy tree bears good fruit, but the diseased tree bears bad fruit. A healthy tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a diseased tree bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus you will recognize them by their fruits (Matthew 7:15-20).

Maybe we think that "false prophets" were people who did their mischief during Bible times, but not any more. Or maybe we think they're people who are way out there—the David Koreshes and Jim Joneses of the world.

But look at what Jesus says—they come in sheep's clothing. That's become a cliché, so maybe we don't really think about what it means anymore. What he's saying is that these people who are lying to us look very appealing. They seem harmless, even angelic. They're nice and friendly and kind.

But on the inside they're wolves. They want to destroy you, rip you apart, kill you. They want to take you to hell.

We ought to pay attention.

All this brings us back to something we know but sometimes forget: We shouldn't ever let anyone tell us anything about God without our consulting the Bible to make sure it's right. People—even good, honest folks—make mistakes, and then of course some people are willfully dishonest.

Our faith is in Jesus Christ, not in a man or a woman or a church or a creed. We trust the Bible, not the sermons or books of fallible people.

How can we know? Jesus said to look at their fruit. Look at their lives and teachings. Compare their words with the words of Scripture.

Most of you who read this go to church and probably consume religious literature of some sort. And that's good, of course. We all need to worship and fill ourselves with thoughts of God.

But be careful. Never take anything you hear—whether it's from these articles or from your preacher or any other source—to be the gospel truth . . . unless it comes from the gospel source, the Word of God.

False teachers don't announce their presence, nor do they tell you about their plan to lead you astray. They look good, sound good, and make you feel good.

But they're incredibly dangerous. —Chuck

### Should I Just Be Friends With Christians?

Making friends is a really important part of being a human. God created us as social beings who long to be in relationship with others, so it's no wonder that for teenagers, our friends are one of the most important things in our lives! But if you're a Christian teen, you might have wondered: should I just be friends with other Christians? The short answer to that question is no!

All people are created in the image of God. In Genesis 1, we are told that God created humans in his image. Not just Christians, but all of us! Your Hindu friend, your Muslim mate, your atheist pal—all of them are created in God's image and have inherent worth and dignity. Obviously, it would be best if they also followed Jesus, but they are not worth less because they don't. Jesus died for all of us before we became Christians.

We are called to love everyone. In Matthew 23, Jesus tells his followers that the second greatest commandment is for us to love our neighbors as ourselves. The Samaritan and the man he helps are of different faiths, but Jesus uses them as an example of the love and care we are meant to show to each other.

It's a great opportunity to show and share the gospel. When you become friends with a non-Christian, you may be the person they look to as an example of what it means to follow Jesus. You're the one they'll think of when Christians are mentioned in the media or when one of their other friends criticizes Christianity. A quick warning—now having said all that . . . we do need to be a little careful when becoming friends with non-Christians. Often, non-Christians will have different ideas of what is right and wrong to us. That doesn't mean we need to cut them out of our lives, but we may need to be prepared to stand up and say "no" if they want us to do something we aren't comfortable with.

**So what's the solution?** Well, have lots of non-Christian friends, but also have lots of Christian friends!
