# Our Current Unit of Study: MONET TIMELINE

Students have been learning about the life and art of Claude Monet, the father of Impressionism. We are reading a Monet biography and several other picture books about him. As we read, we're recording the major events from his life on a timeline. This reinforces social studies skills and helps students understand how major life events affected Monet's work. We are creating four pieces of artwork inspired by his famous paintings: Bridge Over a Pool of Water Lilies, Tulip Fields with the Rijnsburg Windmill, The Stroll, and Water Lilies: The Agapanthus Triptych. Once finished, we will assemble our work into a portfolio.



This landscape, inspired by Monet, depicts a tulip field. We were able to create a sense of depth by making the rows of tulips get smaller as they approach the horizon.

#### Essential Questions

In every unit, there are some big questions we'll explore while looking at and making art. Here is the question we're pondering during this unit:

 How does art help us understand the lives of people of different times, places, and cultures?

## Learning Objectives

Here are the things I want students to know and be able to do in this unit:

- I can use and care for art materials responsibly.
- I can use lines with a variety of qualities: thick/thin, long/short, solid/ broken.
- I can create a landscape with a foreground, middle ground, and background.
- I can mix colors in a variety of media: tempera, liquid watercolor, tissue paper.
- I can reflect with others about the choices I made when creating artwork.
- I can interpret art by describing the mood and subject matter.

### Looking Forward

We'll be using some new materials and techniques to make two more Monetinspired artworks over the next few weeks: liquid watercolor and decoupage.
