The Weekly Parsha



Parshas Vayeishev

"Yehudah recognized, and he said, 'She is right; it is from me, inasmuch as I did not give her to Shelah my son.'" (Bereishis 38:26)

Yehudah was a much respected person in an extremely high position. He was actually considered the king of all of the tribes of Israel. Suddenly he found himself in a very embarrassing situation. His daughter-in-law was found to be pregnant and he himself had sentenced her to be burned to death. Now she revealed to him secretly that he was, in fact, the father. He faced a great dilemma. On the one hand, how could he let an innocent woman and her twin babies be put to death? On the other hand, his prestige and his entire career were at stake. How could he admit publicly what he had done?

Yehudah decided that, come what may, he must be honest. He announced that "She is right; it is from me," and thought that he had forfeited everything. But Rashi brings the words of Chazal that a Heavenly Voice cried out that "It is from Me that this happened." Hashem Himself declared that He wanted Tamar to bear Yehudah's children, from whom would come out the future kings of Israel and even Moshiach himself. Thus Yehudah did not suffer by doing the right thing.

This is meant to be a lesson for us that one does not lose by being honest.

My mentor, Reb Yaakov Kaminetsky, zt"l, was known to be extremely strict about telling the truth, no matter what the consequences might be. He once told me the following story.

Reb Yaakov left his family in Europe and traveled to the States to try to get a position in the "New World" and bring his family there. After much disappointment, he finally was offered a job as the Rav of the Jewish community in Toronto, Canada. A festive dinner was hosted in his honor, and the head of the community, a prominent, rich man (whose name, I believe, was Mr. Rubenstein), rose to greet the new rabbi to the community. A dvar Torah was in order, but the layman said some drasha which Reb Yaakov realized was simply not true. Reb Yaakov was in a dilemma. To publicly correct the gentleman would be very untactful, and might even cost the new rabbi his job, a job which he needed so dearly. On the other hand, Reb Yaakov deliberated, to let the vort pass uncorrected would give the people the

impression that he agreed that it was true, and this he simply could not do.

Finally, it was Reb Yaakov's turn to speak. With a heavy heart, he did what he knew must be done. He objected to the community leader's piece of Torah, explained why it was not true, and proceeded to interpret the passage properly, all the while convinced that he had sacrificed a golden opportunity for his principles.

However, Reb Yaakov said, the speaker was greatly impressed with this uncompromising rabbi, and immediately became his dedicated follower who always stood loyally at the Rav's side, in every communal matter, all through the years he served as Rabbi of Toronto. With this episode of his life, Reb Yaakov taught us that the truth need not hurt.

May we always follow the path of truth and then we will be truly happy in this world and in the World-to-Come.

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The Sparks of Moshiach

It is understood that the Torah does not necessarily follow a chronological order. In many of the parshios, there are events that take place that are seemingly out of order, or do not flow with the rest of the parsha. Occasionally there are verses, or even entire chapters, that do not seem to relate to the rest of the story, but if one searches and delves deeper, the connection can often be found. We find such a chapter in this week's parsha, Chapter 38, the story of Yehudah and Tamar.

Chapter 37 concludes with Yosef being sold by the Midianites to Potiphar, "a courtier of Paraoth, the Chamberlain of the Butchers" (Bereishis 37:36), and Chapter 38 begins with "It was at that time that Yehudah went down from his brothers and turned away toward an Adullamite man whose name was Hirah" (ibid. 38:1). Other than Yehudah being the one who suggested selling Yosef into slavery, there seems to be no connection to the two chapters. Rashi explains the juxtaposition as follows: "To teach you that Yehudah's brothers took him down from his greatness when they saw the distress of their father. They said, 'You said to sell him. Had you said to return him, we would have listened to you'" (Tanchuma Yashan 8; Shemos Rabbah 42:3).

This entire chapter tells the story of Yehudah and Tamar, and the events that led up to the apparent illicit encounter that resulted in the birth of their twin boys, Peretz and Zerah. Chapter 39 picks up right where Chapter 37 left off with "And Yosef had been brought down to Mitzraim" (ibid. 39:1), as if the previous chapter had never interrupted the story of Yosef.

I have always wondered why the Torah interjects this story of Yehudah and Tamar into the story of Yosef, and how, if at all, these two episodes were related. In order to try and resolve this matter, we need to take a look at two earlier pasukim from Sefer Bereishis.

In Parshas Lech Lecha, Hashem says to Avraham, "Know with certainty that your offspring shall be aliens in a land not their own -- and they will serve them, and they will oppress them -- four hundred years. But also the nation that they will serve, I shall judge, and afterwards they will leave with great wealth" (ibid. 15:13-14). In Parshas Vayeitzei, Hashem appears to Yaakov in his dream of the ladder and says, "Behold, I am with you; I will guard you wherever you go, and I will return you to this soil; for I will not forsake you until I will have done what I have spoken about you" (ibid. 28:15). Hashem's promise to Avraham is an obvious allusion to the galus and servitude in Mitzraim. However, the promise to Yaakov seems more long-term; that Hashem will be with Yaakov (Klal Yisroel) until the "End of Days," when His promise will be fulfilled -- the Final Redemption and return to Eretz Yisroel, not merely the redemption from Mitzraim.

It seems to me that these two chapters are directly related to each other in the sense that they represent the two "bookends" of the entire history of the Jewish people! By placing these two chapters together, the Torah is teaching us that Hashem, in His Infinite Wisdom, was simultaneously setting into motion the beginning of the long galus for Bnei Yisroel, starting with Yosef being sold into slavery and going down to Mitzraim, and creating the sparks of the Moshiach, the Final Redeemer, through the union of Yehudah and Tamar.

Acting as the agent of Hashem, Yehudah's "decision" to sell Yosef and his seemingly inappropriate relationship with Tamar was all really a part of the Divine Plan; the fulfillment of Hashem's promise to Avraham and Yaakov, literally charting the course of history for the Jewish people. From the beginning, Yehudah was destined for greatness, proving himself to be zoche to leadership and Malchus.
