The MedStar Georgetown Nurse Residency Program provides New Graduate Nurses with mentoring and support that are critical to their professional development. Our program is one of the elite Vizient/AACN Nurse Residency Programs and focuses on the following key elements:

- Transitioning from the role of a novice to an advanced beginner throughout the first year of practice
- Developing effective decision-making skills related to clinical judgment and performance
- Providing clinical nursing leadership at the point-of-care
- Strengthening the Nurse Resident's commitment to nursing as a professional career choice
- Formulating an individual development plan for the Nurse Resident's new clinical role
- Incorporating research-based evidence linked to outcomes into clinical practice

As a MGUH Nurse Resident, you will participate in the following activities:

- Monthly seminars and learning activities
- Scavenger hunt around Washington, D.C.
- Evidence-based practice project related to unit specialty

While this program extends throughout the Nurse Resident's first year of practice, it lays the foundation for a successful nursing career for many years to follow. A two-year, full-time commitment upon completion of unit-based orientation is required from all Nurse Residents.
