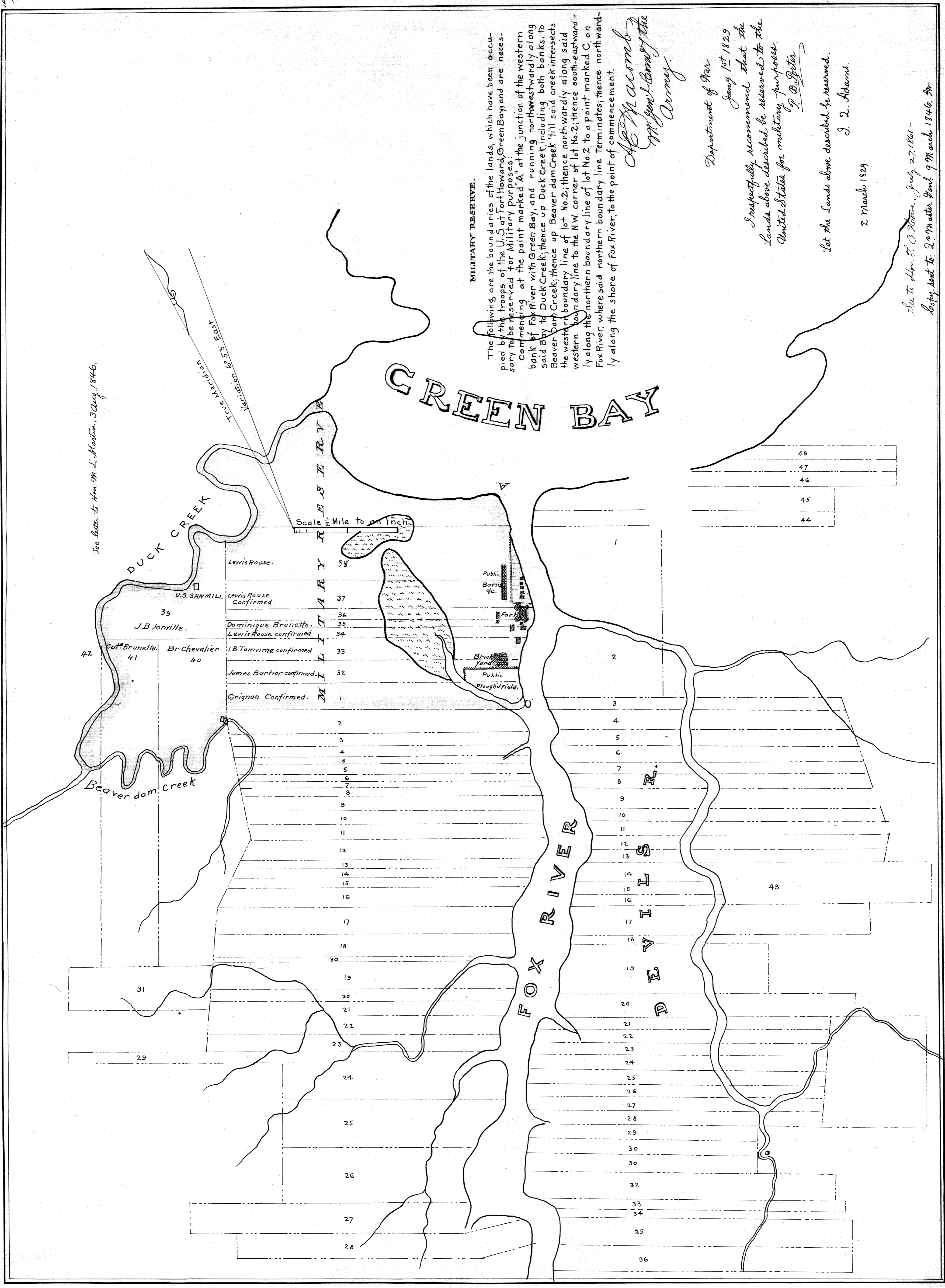

See letter to Hon. M. L. Austin, 3 Aug 1846.



MILITARY RESERVE.

The following are the boundaries of the lands, which have been occupied by the troops of the U.S. at Fort Howard, Green Bay, and are necessary to be reserved for Military purposes:

Commencing at the point marked 'A' at the junction of the western bank of Fox River with Green Bay, and running northwardly along said bank to Duck Creek; thence up Duck Creek, including both banks, to Beaver dam Creek; thence up Beaver dam Creek, 'till said creek intersects the western boundary line of lot No. 2; thence northwardly along said western boundary line to the N.W. corner of lot No. 2; thence south-eastwardly along the northern boundary line of lot No. 2, to a point marked 'C', on Fox River, where said northern boundary line terminates; thence northwardly along the shore of Fox River, to the point of commencement.
