asaws burned 20 French on the day of the battle, including Father Senat, d'Artaguet, Vincennes, de Coulonges, de St. Ange, Jr., du Tisé, d'Esgly and de Tonty. Vincennes has a monument in the post which he founded, and which was sometimes called St. Ange, from an officer who commanded there. From the latter term, apparently, came the name of Ange Gardien, given to the mission. Jou-

John Baptist Bissot, Sieur de Vincennes, officer in a detachment of the marine service, was the tenth child of Francis Bissot, and was born at Quebec in January, 1668. Louis Jolliet married his sister, Clara Frances. Vincennes in 1696 married at Montreal, Mary Margaret Forestier, and Tanguay, Dict. Généal., i., p. 56, gives the names of four children. The statement in some Western writers that his name was Morgan is unfounded.
