

If The commandant commit any Fault, it is better
to admonish him privately than publicly. 54

Public Rebuke, unless well arranged beforehand
and resorted to according to Necessity, embitters
Minds against Us. Such indiscreet Zeal does more
harm than good. I have seen unpleasant results
happen through it to one of Ours. 55

He must, so far as possible, be ever gay and
Affable, and not be too familiar either with Any
Frenchmen or with Any Savages, whether men or
women. 56

Except in case of Necessity or of strong suspicion,
he must be careful not to go at Night into The
Cabins, especially where there are Young women
and marriageable Girls. They often give a wrong
interpretation to this. 57

He must not be too long in saying prayers, or
importune Them, Especially among Strangers. 58

Let him not marry with the rites of the Church
any Frenchman to a Savage woman, without The
consent of the parents, and without Monseigneur's
approval. 59

If A Frenchman abuse any Savage woman, let the
missionary reprove him privately; and, if the sin
be scandalous, let him do so publicly. But, if The
Frenchman continue, let the missionary, as soon as
possible, inform Monsieur The Director and The
Gentlemen, and The relatives; and let him deprive
Both of the Sacraments, *ad Tempus*. 60
