

The attention of members is directed to several quartzite spades which have been recovered in recent years in northwestern Wisconsin counties. In form these are similar to the fine flint spades of southern Illinois. A specimen in the States Historical Museum was obtained from an Indian camp site on the shore of Island Lake, in Rusk County.

Indian names have been selected for some of the ships of the Emergency Fleet built, and in course of construction, at the Hog Island shipyard.

On Labor Day the Sauk County Historical Society will hold a field meeting on the site of old Fort Winnebago, at Portage. This meeting promises to be one of unusual interest. Members of the Wisconsin Archeological Society are invited to be present.
