

value of these mineral resources, as estimated by Indian superintendents and the Geological Survey, amounts to \$933,947,224.

Mr. H. E. Cole of Baraboo, a member of the Wisconsin Archeological Society, is collecting information concerning the early taverns of Wisconsin with a view to publishing a book on this subject. His personal researches in quest of information on this subject and of photographs of the old taverns still standing in the state have this year carried him into many counties. Copies of all of the data and pictures obtained by him are to be filed in the archives of the State Historical Society.
