At the last annual meeting of the Society, the receipt of the deed for 640 acres of land in Coleman County, Texas—the promised gift for our binding fund by the late Hon. John Catlin, one of the honorary vice-presidents of the Society, was suitably acknowledged to Mrs. Catlin and her daughter.

We have since learned of the death of Hon. Stephen Taylor, of Philadelphia, another of our honorary vice-presidents. Mr. Taylor died on the 8th of December, 1877, leaving by his will a bequest of \$1,000 to our Society, to be paid after Mrs. Taylor's death.

Mr. Taylor came to Wisconsin in 1835, as a prominent organizer of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, establishing a lodge in Mineral Point in that year; and soon after became assist-
