CESSION TO DOMINIQUE DUCHARME, AT KAUKAUNA.

[Translated from the French.]

n One Thousand Seven hundred and ninety-three, Were esent Wabisipine and Le Tabac noir, who have of their wn free will yielded and ceded to Monsieur Dominique Ducharme the land from the summit of the portage at Cacalin to the end of the Meadow below it, with a depth of forty arpents; and upon the other side, facing the said portage, a tract four arpents wide by Thirty deep. The aforesaid vendors are content and satisfied with two bar-
