

Marriages at Mackinac

July 30, 1796, after granting dispensation from three bans, in the presence of [witnesses] Joseph Laurent Bertrand [and Felicité Pillett] widow of Jean Louis la Carignat, we received their mutual consent and gave them the nuptial Benediction * * * in the presence of Jean Ecuyer and of François le Sieur, all of whom signed with us.³⁴

August 8, 1796, after granting dispensation from the three bans, to Michel Brisbois, son of age of Joseph and of Marguerite Nault, of the parish of Yamaska, diocese of Quebec, and to Domitille Gautier, minor daughter of Charles and Madeleine Chevalier, of the parish of Michilimackinac, authorized by M^r Her father, I received their consent and gave them the nuptial Benediction according to the rite of the Roman Church, there being present and consenting: Charles Gautier, father of the bride, Isidore la Croix, John Reeves, Antoine Guillory, all of whom signed with us, as did also the husband, the wife declaring that she could not sign her name when thereunto requested.
