It is when we experience the death of a loved one that we start to comprehend the seriousness of the sins of mankind, including our our sinfulness. Sin always brings death. ## **Guilt and Forgiveness**

The reason why every person who sins will have to die one day, is because sin makes us guilty before God. Every sinful thought, every sinful action, every sinful word makes us guilty before God. God is holy and just, and is too pure to be able to look at our sin and do nothing about it.

When God forgives our sins, He removes our guilt and shows us compassion instead. As a gift to sinners who repent, God gives eternal life.
