The members of Pacific Northwest Grain & Feed Association are pleased to announce our plans to award multiple scholarships up to \$2,000 **to qualified applicants who are either working for, or have family members working with, our regional industry.**

As the cost of college education continues to increase, obtaining an advanced education is becoming harder to achieve. Our scholarship program is dedicated to helping top students reach their academic potential and career goals, while responding to the financial pressures placed on their families.

To qualify for this award, applicants must be high school seniors, college freshmen and/or sophomores, who have either been accepted, or are currently enrolled in a 2- or 4-year accredited college or university, and **connected with our grain and feed membership** in some way. Previous recipients of the PNWGFA Scholarship are not be eligible to apply again. The deadline for applying for these awards will be April 3, 2015, so act now! **(Applications need to be postmarked no later than April 3, 2015.)**

The recipients of the Pacific Northwest Grain & Feed Association Scholarship grants will be notified via phone and by letter by mid-May. Special recognition to the membership will be given at the Annual Convention June 25, in Sun Valley, ID. Recipients are welcome, but not required, to attend this event.

Instructions

Following these five steps will improve your chances of being selected as a scholarship recipient.

1. Type or print the application.
2. Complete and return application as soon as possible. The application deadline is April 3, 2015.
3. Scholarship awards are based on the applicant's GPA, Work Experience and Leadership Qualities, with a possible total of 100 points. Failure to complete one or more sections of the application will disqualify your application.
4. Use the space provided, and be as concise as possible. Within reason, additional information may be included on supplemental sheets.
5. Recipients of the scholarship awards will be notified by the Association by mid-May. Funds will be sent to the scholastic institutions within 5 weeks of the start of the school year. All applicants will receive notification via letter by May 31, 2015.

Eligibility:

All Direct members in good standing with the Pacific Northwest Grain & Feed Association:

1. Immediate family members of a Direct member
2. Employee and/or a legal dependent of a Direct member
3. Owner/Patrons, or their legal dependents, of a Direct member firm.
4. All candidates must have received a letter of acceptance or be enrolled in an accredited college, university or community college. Consideration will be given to, but not limited to students who have chosen a career in some area of agriculture, business, home economics or vocational education.
5. Applicants may only be awarded a PNWGFA Scholarship once; previous winners not eligible again.

Application Procedure:

The following must be submitted:

1. Complete Scholarship Application.
2. A letter of introduction and recommendation from a PNWGFA Direct member in good standing.

Selection Process:

1. The scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, potential to succeed, demonstrated leadership, extracurricular accomplishments, work experience and an evaluation by a counselor or advisor.
2. All recipients must enter school no later than the fall term following the announcement of the scholarship.
