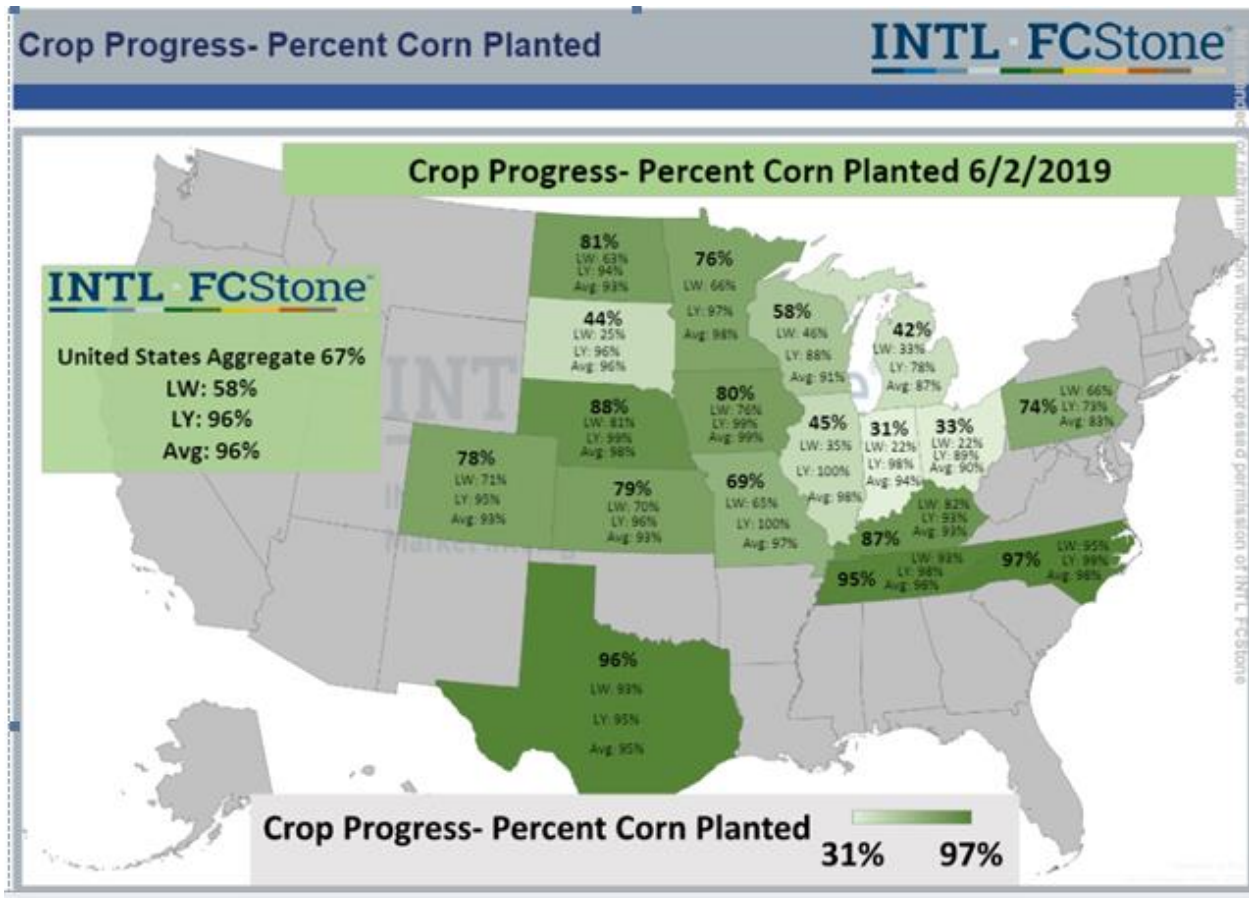

Producers, here is the latest corn crop progress report that was released on Monday. The US is still 29% percent behind the five year average on corn planting. It looks like the eastern Corn Belt may get a day or two of planting in before they get more rain, most of the Corn Belt has hit the issuance date deadlines and the eastern belt will hit it tomorrow June 5. It is hard to say how many farmers will keep going after the deadline but there are still a lot of unfit acres to be planted. Corn export inspections were nothing to write how about last week coming in at 743mt which is about half of what it was last year but we are still on track for meeting the USDA numbers.



Here are the wheat ratings for the week, the ratings increased by three percent from last weeks and most of that was due to increased rating in Montana, Colorado and Kansas. Wheat had good export inspection last week coming in at 21.1 million bushels and the trade was looking for 15-20 million. At the close today wheat was down 18 at the close, this is just simple reminder of how good of a crop that could be out there as of now. There are still some concerns in Australia due to dry conditions and a few other areas which may lead to helping hand later on but it is hard to say as of now.
