Edison Bin Update

The damaged beans were vacuumed off the top, while the good beans were moved into another bin from the bottom/sides. We have not moved or weighed the total amount damaged, but it was not a lot. Now that the cleanup has been completed, we will make a determination for the repairs needed. Our plans are to complete the needed repairs yet this summer. My thanks to all the local fire departments who responded that Saturday. Many of our neighbors and Ag Valley employees serve as Firemen/EMTs, so a special thanks to you. The response was fast, the fire contained and of utmost importance – no one was hurt. (No jokes about our luck here in Edison – I have heard them all!)
