How To Have a Successful Gospel Meeting

Local congregations, when planning gospel meetings, want them to be very successful. Since this is the case, how does a local congregation plan to have a successful meeting?

First, the preacher who will conduct the meeting must be a proclaimer of the gospel. Paul penned, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. For therein is the righteousness of God revealed from faith to faith: as it is written, the just shall live by faith" (Rom. 1:16,17). Since the power is in the gospel, the man coming to preach should preach the powerful gospel. If people are going to be saved, it will be through the gospel message. The speaker must be a gospel preacher!

Second, the meeting will be successful if the local body has made proper preparation. Since the gospel is going to be proclaimed, it is important to have people in attendance who need to hear the soul saving message. Members at the local body need to invite their friends and neighbors so God's word can be heard and obeyed. People may not immediately obey the gospel, but the seed of the kingdom will be planted in their hearts, and maybe someone else will water, allowing our God to provide the increase.

Third, the meeting will be a success when members of the local church participate in the services. Have you made plans to be at every service to support the meeting? Are your family members making preparation to attend each service? These are decisions that need to be made long before the meeting even begins. It is important for non-Christians to hear the gospel, it is also important for Christians to assemble to hear the word of God as well. Paul told the Corinthian brethren, "Moreover, brethren, I declare unto the gospel which I preached unto you, which also ye have received, and wherein ye stand; by which also ye are saved, if ye keep in memory what I preached unto you, less ye have believed in vain" (1 Cor. 15:1,2). Christians must stand in the gospel and keep it in memory. A gospel meeting is an avenue Christians can use to do that.

Finally, the success of the gospel meeting depends upon the participation of the local church. When the congregation is singing and praying, will each of us sing and pray with the spirit and with the understanding (1 Cor. 14:15)? As we hear the word of God, will we be like the Bereans who received the word with all readiness of mind and searched the Scriptures daily (Acts 17:11)? Will you take notes and attentively listen to the preaching of the gospel?

When everyone does their part with love and fervor, the gospel meeting will always be successful. May the Lord help us to have a great meeting and to glorify and honor Him in all we do.

The Parable of the Mustard Seed

If you were to write a book about the greatest kingdom in the world, you would probably say something about a very large kingdom with unmatched military power, an indestructible economy, and a capable king. To human eyes, these things are perfectly sensible but from a divine standpoint, they mean nothing. Jesus promised to build His kingdom (Matt. 16:18) and it is far superior to every human kingdom (Dan. 2:44), but its origin and characteristics are not worldly (John 18:36). The parable of the mustard seed (Matt. 13:31-32) reveals some of these divine attributes, particularly as it relates to the growth of the kingdom.

The mustard seed was the smallest seed used by the Jews in that time. However, its insignificance in size is overshadowed by the size of its fruit. Consider the church from this vantage point. From a purely human standpoint, its origin is insignificant. Its founder was born into the world in lowly circumstances. He grew up in an insignificant town (Matt. 2:23; John 1:46; 7:52). He had no formal training John 7:15), no vast deposits of wealth (2) Cor. 8:9) and was rejected and murdered by His own people in the most insulting and gruesome way possible (John 1:11). Yet, the Kingdom of Christ was established and witnessed unprecedented growth in the first century (Col. 1:6).

It is encouraging to note that the kingdom can still grow today as it did then. "The seed of the kingdom is the word of God" (Luke 8:11). We serve the same God and have been given the same task. If we have the same conviction and spread the same seed, we can see the same results (Rom. 1:16; 10:18; Acts 8:4). The parable of the mustard seed reminds us that though man may see the kingdom of God

as small and insignificant, it is, in reality, greater than any kingdom man could ever imagine.
