# Lessons From Luke Peter's Wife's Mother

nd he arose out of the synagogue, and entered into Simon's house. And Simon's wife's mother was taken with a great fever; and they be sought him for her. And he stood over her, and rebuked the fever; and it left her: and immediately she arose and ministered unto them." (Lk. 4:38-39)

Each of the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, & Luke) record the occasion of Jesus healing Peter's mother-in-law. A quick glance may leave one with the impression that the record is simply another example of God's approval of Jesus by "miracles, wonders, and signs" (Acts 2:22). However, a closer and more diligent observation of the text provides spiritual lessons that serve to strengthen our faith.

First, one should note the sickness. Matthew and Mark note simply that the woman was "sick of a fever." (Mt. 8:14; Mk. 1:30). Luke the physician reveals a more serious nature of her illness identifying her fever as "great." According to Hobart (The Medical Language of Luke), the ancient Greeks divided fevers into great and small. Also, the wording of Luke indicates the fever to have been continuous, severe, and possibly even a recurring condition. Furthermore, according to Luke there seems to have been a sense of urgency for her life. Peculiar to Luke's account is the term "besought" that carries the sense of intreating or even begging. While a fever is a common illness among men the severity of the fever indicates something that needed to be addressed without hesitation.

A spiritual lesson to be drawn here is the parallel of physical sickness to sin. Just as sickness is common in the human population, even so sin is common to all humanity (Rom. 3:23; 1 Jn. 1:8; et al). Additionally, the way one becomes sick provides a parallel for us to consider. Causes of sickness vary from low immunity, associating with one who is "contagious," and a failure to properly take care of one's health. Each of these have a spiritual parallel.

The greatest of temptations often come when we are at weak points in our lives, when our "spiritual immunity" is low. Satan's temptations of Jesus provides an excellent example (Lk. 4:1-2). A close association with those who live a life of sin is most certainly a means by which many have fallen from steadfast faithfulness. David instructed, "Blessed is the man that walketh not in the counsel of the ungodly, nor standeth in the way of sinners, nor sitteth in the seat of the scornful" (Ps. 1:1). And on no less than two occasions Paul emphasized Corinthians how associations may corrupt: "Know ye not that a little leaven leaveneth the whole lump" (1 Cor. 5:6), and "Evil companionships corrupt good morals" (1 Cor. 15:33, ASV).

Moreover, a failure to grow in the knowledge of God's word leaves one at a high risk of being "tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine" (Eph. 4:14) and "overtaken" (Gal. 6:1) by the adversary (1 Pt. 5:8). To prevent sin sickness Paul encour-

aged the consumption of "sound doctrine" (Titus 2:1) and being "sound in the faith" (Titus 2:2) while Peter admonished "As newborn babes desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby" (1 Pt. 2:2).

Just as physical sickness is common to all even so sin (spiritual sickness) is common to all—the sickness may at times be more severe and the cause may vary but all are susceptible. In our next study we will consider Luke's account of *Peter's Wife's Mother* and draw some lessons from the *Savior* and from the *Servant*.

#### The Front Pew

It can be scary. It can be intimidating. It can seem like a mile's walk away. That first step can be one of the most difficult. This past Sunday, it looked like 15 people came forward. In actuality, it was just 2 precious souls who made that brave step forward. Everyone else was there to show love. Everyone else was there for support. Everyone else was there to encourage. It was beautiful. It was uplifting. It was biblical.

This is how we help bear one another's burdens (Galatians 6:2).

This is how we help to encourage each other away from sin (Hebrews 3:13).

This is what it's like to be apart of God's family (1 Timothy 3:15).

This is what love looks like (1 John 3:18; 4:12-13).

If we are about helping each other get to heaven, and we should be, then no one should sit on the front pew alone. Confessing sin will always be scary, but the front pew doesn't have to be. Let's do what we can to make the front pew one where that person is met with support, prayer, love, and with open arms.
