SOUND DOCTRINE

In our previous study we noted a general theme of sound doctrine in Paul's first letter to Timothy. Throughout this letter, Paul not only emphasizes soundness of teaching and faithfulness to the doctrine of Christ but also reinforces this thought with bookend exhortations to his son in the faith: "charge some that they teach no other doctrine" (1:3), and "these things teach and exhort" (6:2). Considering the text of 1 Timothy 6:1-5, we highlighted that sound doctrine is defended by our conduct and how Paul defined sound doctrine. Let's continue our study of Sound Doctrine noting how some despise sound doctrine and how sound doctrine is distinguished from doctrines of men.

Sound Doctrine Despised

Paul next reveals the true character of those who despise and refuse to consent to sound doctrine. Blinded by pride they become ignorant of knowledge and spend their time "doting about questions and strife's of words" (6:4). According to Thayer, the word translated doting carries the sense of one who is "sick of any ailment of the mind." In essence Paul says that one who despises sound doctrine becomes so consumed with debating trivial matters that rather than being sound in the faith (Titus 1:13; 2:2) they become diseased in the mind. They do not "give heed unto the doctrine" that will save them and others (1 Tim. 4:16), but stir up envy and strife

which leads to slanderous accusations and hurtful suspicions among brethren.

The apostle further notes that those who despise sound doctrine engage in "perverse disputing's" or "wrangling's" of men (1 Tim. 6:5). In other words, they continually cause irritation and friction among brethren. Such men have become corrupted in their minds and destitute of the truth. How tragic! Those who despise the healthy and wholesome doctrine they once held dear now possess minds that are rotten having defrauded themselves of the truth. So corrupt of mind are those who despise sound doctrine that rather than consent to wholesome words they seek to make a living off of them.

Sound Doctrine Distinguished

What is our responsibility to those who despise sound doctrine and corrupt the wholesome words of Jesus Christ? Paul makes it clear that we are to withdraw from them (1 Tim. 6:5). Though the inclusion of this final phrase is disputed by biblical scholars the principle is clearly set forth in Scripture (cf. 2 Tim. 3:1-5; Rom. 16:17-18; 2 Thess. 3:16). The withdrawing of our fellowship from those who reject sound doctrine distinguishes us from the world. Paul admonished, "if any man obey not our word by this epistle, note that man, and have no company with him, that he may be ashamed" (2 Thess. 3:14). To the Philippians he wrote, "Brethren, be followers together of me, and mark them which walk so as ye have us for an example" (Phil. 3:17). Clearly, following after sound doctrine distinguishes from those who in their pride refuse to consent to the wholesome words of Jesus Christ. Further, our withdrawing fellowship from those who teach other doctrine also serves to distinguish that healthy wholesome doctrine we hold so dear from doctrines that corrupt.

Paul's emphasis of teaching and walking in sound wholesome doctrine is abundantly clear. One who gives himself to the meditation sound doctrine is easily identified and he is a benefit to all with whom he may come into contact (1 Tim. 4:15-16). May we ever strive faithfully to proclaim and persevere in that sound wholesome doctrine that promotes reverence and respect toward God.

Turning Pain Into Pearls



An incredible process begins when a foreign material, or a parasite, makes its way inside the shell of an oyster and begins causing damage. The intruder can threaten the life of the oyster, so something must be done. To protect itself, the oyster seals off the threat by using the same material that lines the inside of its shell (called nacre). The oyster cannot spit out the intruder, so it covers it with many layers of precious material, thus making it into a pearl. In other words, the producing of a pearl is a defense mechanism. The result? The painful intruders are turned into the beautiful

pearls we have today.

There is much we could learn from the oyster. Too often, people intrude into our lives with qualities like discouragement, lies, insults, and anger. There is no doubt these cause damage. There is no doubt these can destroy relationships. However, when we respond in a kind and loving way, we can take someone who intended to do harm, respond in love, and transform that person into something beautiful for the Lord. Incredible changes can take place when we slowly respond to such intruders with layers of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23).

As sad as it is, hurtful words and actions are going to enter our lives, but how we react to them is completely up to us. Peter said it best:

"To sum up, all of you be harmonious, sympathetic, brotherly, kindhearted, and humble in spirit; **not returning evil for evil or insult for insult, but giving a blessing instead**; for you were called for the very purpose that you might inherit a blessing" (1 Peter 3:8-9).
