TENDERNESS

I often speak of my mother as a tough disciplinarian. That she was. But her tenderness was also interesting. For what it's worth, here are a few thoughts.

She was tender toward the grieving. As she had opportunity (cf.Gal.6:9,10), my mother would attend funerals, extending mercy even to those she did not know very well. She bemoaned the fact that people do not take the time for memorial services as they once did. She took it upon herself to visit such services, often finding mostly just a few there to encourage the family. Her Lord was "touched by the feeling of our infirmities" (Heb.4:15) and so was she. It has been said that the death of a mother is the first tear shed without her.

She was tender toward the sick. Many, many nights she was up attending to the fevers of us siblings. This was often followed by hours at the doctor's office. Decent mothers do this because they are made "in the image and likeness of God" (Gen.1:26,27). God made us "upright" (Eccl.7:29) and, like Him, we want to be compassionate toward the sick, (Matt.8:14-17).

She had a heart for the lost. My mother was not reared in the church, but once converted, she sought to help her sisters learn the gospel. My aunt Barbara often went with Mom to midweek Bible study. Through this influence, my aunt heard the gospel many times and grew in her respect for the Bible. It is our prayer and confidence that she will obey one day very soon.

She had a heart for dad. Wives are taught to love their husbands (Titus 2:3,4). This my mother did with great passion, serving him in joy and conflict. She made sure Dad had what he needed to do his work every day (food, clothing, rest, support). A true "help-meet" she was (Gen.2:18). He was first in her heart and that was a powerful lesson for us kids. Dad passed 9 years before Mom and she insisted on honoring him at every opportunity during that time.

She was thoughtful toward the great commission. As Mom grew sick and her strength deteriorated, her strong-willed intent was that, as much as possible, not to be a hindrance to her children's work in the church. Of course, we would never consider her a hindrance, but she had no problem expressing her will with remarkable clarity. Like John, and like all godly mothers, in her heart, she was saying, "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth" (2 John 4). I hope one day to be able to live up to the expectations of the Lord...and Mom.


