WHAT IS A LAMENT?

"O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often would I have gathered your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you would not!" Luke 13:34

These words are Jesus' lament over the city of Jerusalem as He responds to threats upon His life. A lament is a passionate expression of grief or sorrow. Look closely at our Savior's words.

First, see the double use of the title: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem." This double use of terms shows the Lord's concern. He was concerned about Martha's distractions, so He says, "Martha, Martha, thou art anxious and troubled about many things" (Luke 10:38-42). Jesus was concerned for Peter's faith, so He says, "Simon, Simon, Satan desires to have you, that he may sift you like wheat" (Luke 22:31). So, here, the Lord is concerned for the spiritual status of many in Jerusalem. Later, He explains, "Would that you, even you, had known on this day the things which make for peace! But now they are hidden from your eyes" (Luke 19:42).

Then, note the character of the city, "the city that kills the prophets." Jerusalem was known for attacking the preachers sent to it (cf. Jeremiah 26:20-23) and it was on the verge of killing the Prophet, in crucifying Jesus (cf. Acts 3:22-24;Matt.21:35). Listen to Stephen: "Which of the prophets did not your fathers persecute? And they killed those who announced beforehand the coming of the Righteous One, whom you have now betrayed and murdered" (Acts 7:52,53). Sin has a way of settling down in an area – like Jerusalem. Plus, what is this hatred toward preachers, which is present even today? Is it envy, fear, vanity, ignorance? Romans 10:15 quotes from Isaiah 52:7 and says, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!"

Next, we are reminded of Jesus' affection for all of us. He considers us as His little children, his chicks. "How often I would have gathered you together as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings..." The Lord wants to protect us "under His wings" (cf.Ruth 2:12; Psa.17:8; 36;7). No one loves us like God and He proves it on the cross (Romans 5:8)!

The crux of the lament is this: the fox is after the chicks and Jesus is offering us protection but "you would not" (Luke 13:34; Matt.23:37). Jerusalem was ignoring their God and we are often likewise guilty. God honors us by making us in His image and giving us the ability to choose Him if we will. Listen to Jesus: "you refuse to come to me that you may have life" (John 5:40).

Jesus grieved over Jerusalem, but perhaps it's not too late for us or is it? Can we put away sin, ignorance and hatred and recapture a love for the gospel?
