

## Summary Alberta Hunting Regulations 2014

### 2 types of game: Big game and game bird

#### Documents needed to hunt

1. Wildlife Identification Number: costs \$8 and stays valid for 5 years  
→ Needed **BEFORE** applying for or purchasing any licence or wildlife certificate!
2. Wildlife Certificate: costs \$28.22
3. (Bowhunting permit in case you want to hunt with a bow)
4. Licence to shoot game (price is different for residents and non- residents and depends on the game)  
→ List of game you can shoot is shorter for non-residents!
5. Tag the game when killed (rules can be found in the guide)
6. Register kill at a Fish and Wildlife office (only certain game, check the guide)
7. Check hunting seasons!

For example:

	Resident (Canada)	Non- resident
Black bear	\$15.45	\$63.61
Cougar	\$20.31	\$135.31
Bizon	\$50.00	Not in list

#### Non- resident hunters

- Must be accompanied by licensed guide or a Hunter Host (explained in the regulations guide)

#### Places where it is prohibited to hunt

- Wildlife Sanctuaries
- Road Corridor Wildlife Sanctuaries
- Seasonal Sanctuaries
- Forest Recreation Areas
- **National Parks (you can't hunt in Waterton National Park)**
- Some other restricted areas (can be found in the guide)
