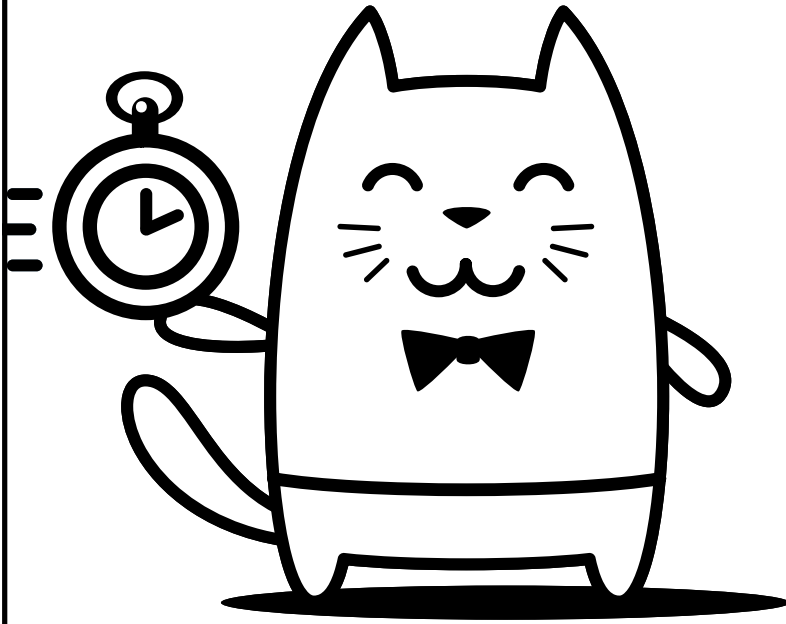

History & Records



Paul VI Catholic High School opened in the fall of 1983 and fielded its first baseball team at the JV level in the spring of 1984. The Panthers played their first season of Varsity baseball the following year in spring of 1985.

PVI has competed in the highly regarded Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC) since 1986. The WCAC was formerly known as the Washington Metro Athletic Conference (WMAC) until the fall of 1993. The WCAC is now comprised of 10 Catholic high schools from Washington DC, Maryland and Virginia. Three different WCAC baseball teams (including Paul VI) have been Nationally ranked in the past 8 seasons. The Conference used a divisional format (North and South) from 1998-2000 and from 2004-2005. The divisional format was dropped again in 2006 and the WCAC is now a straight 9-team conference.

Beyond conference play, PVI competed for the Virginia Catholic High School League (VCHSL) Championship from 1985 to 1991. In 1992, The Virginia Independent Schools Baseball Association (VISBA) was formed to provide a State Championship for all private high schools in the State of Virginia. The VISBA changed its acronym to VISAA in 2006 which stands for Virginia Independent Schools Athletic Association. Today, the VISAA includes almost 80 private schools throughout the State.

In 31 seasons of PVI Varsity Baseball, the Panthers have captured sixteen titles including the WMAC Tournament/Conference Championship (1993), two WCAC South Division Championships (1999 & 2005), two VISBA State Championships (1994 & 2004), three VISAA State Championships (2008, 2009 & 2012), two Southeastern Baseball Classic Championships (2008 & 2009), the DC Sportsfan Challenge Championship (2010), two WCAC Regular Season Championships (2007 & 2008), and three WCAC Tournament 'Conference Championships' in 2007, 2009 & 2012. All 156 championships were won in the past 23 years, including thirteen in the past twelve years.



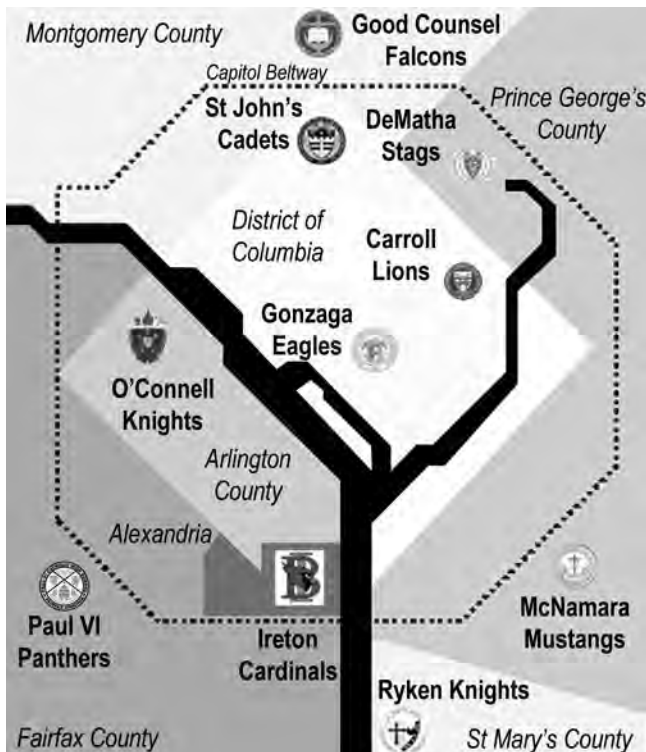

Panther Field

Baseball has been played at Panther Field since 1937, when the Fairfax High School Rebels first took the field at their newly built school. The construction of the campus was performed by the Works Progress Administration, providing badly needed jobs during the Great Depression. After World War II, the athletic complex was named “War Memorial Field” in honor of Fairfax graduates and other veterans lost during that conflict. The Fairfax staff developed a reputation during those years for thorough, careful maintenance of the baseball field, and it was used extensively for tournaments and other amateur play.

In the 1960s, when Fairfax High School moved to its current site, this facility was used as the North Campus of George Mason University. While the Patriots played here, fencing was improved and dugouts and batting cages installed. The dirt berm in left field that is a hallmark of the field—and the bane of many an outfielder over the years—was also installed to cover a low brick wall that had been a previous source of injuries.

The Diocese of Arlington purchased the facility in 1982, and the Paul VI Panthers first played here in the spring of 1983. Improvements from that period include the grandstand and lighting in left field, the pressbox, the flagpole, and the “Panther Pause” concession stand. The name “Panther Field” was added in 1999. Still recognized as one of the finest scholastic baseball venues in Northern Virginia and the WCAC, Panther Field continues its renewal process. A new scoreboard was installed in 2001; the playing surface underwent extensive rehabilitation in 2002, with installation of new dirt and sod in the infield and Bermuda grass in the outfield; and new netting was added above the backstop in 2003.

After completion of the new school gymnasium in the fall of 2003, the complex received a significant face lift entering the 2004 season. The dugouts were renovated and lengthened, and the press box was expanded to include clubhouse and locker facilities. 2005 saw improvements to the backstop netting and clubhouse interior, and a complete rebuild of the batting cages was completed in 2006. Significant portions of the year-to-year maintenance are performed on a volunteer basis by players, parents, and fans at two or three “Field Day” weekends in Late February and early March. The continuing generosity and hard work of the boosters, sponsors, and fans will permit Panthers Baseball to host opponents at one of the finest high school baseball facilities in the area for years to come. Truly a first-class field for a first-class program!

Paul VI is one of only two schools in the conference able to host a night game at all. Day games are great, but nothing beats the thrill and excitement of a game under the lights! Already the finest baseball facility in the metropolitan area, with the help of annual fundraising and dedicated volunteers, Panther Field will be one of the nation’s best in just a few short years.

Varsity Head Coach

Jeff Nolan 14th Year at PVI

A native Californian, Jeff Nolan served as the Associate Head Coach and Pitching Coach for a decade at Paul VI before becoming the Head Coach. Coach Nolan pitched in college at Cal Poly Pomona and was a member of a program that won both the 1980 and 1983 NCAA Division II National Championship. Nolan played under and is heavily influenced by legendary Coach John Scolinos at Cal Poly, who was voted Coach of the 20th Century by the College Baseball Hall of Fame, NCAA Baseball Coach of the Decade for the 1980s, and pitching coach for the 1984 U.S. Olympic team.

During his Cal Poly playing career, Nolan led the team in appearances and lowest earned run average and was voted Most Improved Player by the Cal Poly coaching staff in 1984. He participated in the California College Baseball summer league, Thoroughbred, where he went 22-2 on the mound over three seasons and was named Most Valuable Player, twice.

Upon graduating from Cal Poly, Jeff was invited to tryout with the Chicago Cubs and Kansas City Royals. He then taught American Government and World History at Pomona Catholic High School for a year before pursuing a business career having risen to the level of Chief Executive Officer. While in California, he founded Nolan Baseball Academy in Upland California, providing player instruction and coaching clinics. Coach Nolan was the pitching coach at Mira Costa High School in Manhattan Beach, CA, prior to relocating to Northern Virginia in 1998. He has been coaching at the high school level and above, having spent time in the Clark Griffith Collegiate Summer League as a pitching coach for the Fairfax Nationals as well.

From 2004-2008, PVI pitchers led the WCAC in fewest runs allowed. Coach Nolan has converted non-pitchers into pitchers who have gone on to earn Division I College scholarships. Paul VI has had more pitchers selected to the All WCAC First Team than any program in the conference under Coach Nolan's leadership. He is regarded as one of this area's most accomplished and knowledgeable authorities on pitching and is a sought after speaker on the local and regional baseball coaching clinic circuit.

Nolan was selected as an assistant coach in the 2005, 2006, and 2007 Mid-Atlantic High School All-Star Game and the Crab Claw Classic in the summer of 2015.



Coach Nolan had twice been named a finalist for District 2 Assistant Coach of the Year in 2007 and 2008 (District 2 is comprised of all high schools throughout Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, DC and Virginia). In 2009 Nolan received the District 2 Assistant Coach of the Year Award at the National High School Baseball Coaches Association Annual Convention in Tucson, Arizona.

Coach Nolan was awarded the 2014 WCAC Coach of the Year Award after guiding a relatively young Panthers squad to a 19-6 regular season record in 2014.

Coach Nolan has been married to his wife Greta for 30 years. The couple resides in Centreville, VA. Their daughter, Lindsey (PVI '05), graduated in 2009 with a BS degree in Business Administration from Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles, CA and resides and works in Southern California. Nolan's father Bob pitched in the Cleveland Indians organization from 1950-53. Coach Nolan credits both Coach Scolinos and his dad for his successes and for his love of the game.



Varsity Assistant Coaches

TAD DAVIDOVICH

VARSITY ASSISTANT COACH (INFIELD)

14th Year at PVI

Originally from Chicago, Tad Davidovich was an all district infielder at nearby James Madison High School in Vienna, VA. Following a playing stint on the collegiate level at Division I Samford University in Alabama, he transferred to Mary Washington University where he received a Bachelor's Degree in Historic Preservation.



Davidovich began coaching as an assistant at Madison and as a head coach in AAU summer baseball with the Vienna Mustangs. His 18u Mustang teams regularly competed at the national level and won a bracket championship at the Cocoa Expo International Tournament in 1999. Coach Davidovich joined the Paul VI coaching staff in 2003 and has successfully coached defense and hitters in his 12 seasons with the Panthers. Under the guidance of Coach Davidovich, Paul VI has sent 13 infielders to play at the collegiate level in the last 12 years. In 2005 PVI set school records by fielding .965 as a team, committing just 29 errors in 31 games. The Panthers followed that performance in 2006 with a school record 25 double plays. He has coached the last 19 years at the high school level and above.

Davidovich was also selected as an assistant coach in the 2005 and 2007 Mid-Atlantic High School All-Star Game. From 2006-2007 he was an assistant coach for the Fairfax Nationals of the Clark C. Griffith Collegiate Baseball League (CGL). In 2007 the Nationals turned a league high 39 double plays.

Tad's brother Pete played in the Division III College World Series for Salisbury University. Tad is a life-long Chicago Cubs fan. The nephew of the Cubs former Assistant PR Director and Traveling Secretary, his birth was announced on WGN during a Cubs game. On April 5, 2014 Tad's grandfather (Dan Davidovich) was honored on Wrigley Field before the Cubs-Phillies game for developing a computer program in 1961 that allowed the Cubs to analyze statistics and create a "performance index." This was the first sabermetric program developed by the Cubs and one of the earliest developed in Major League Baseball.

In late 2013 Coach Davidovich started his own company, Hinsdale Design Build, LLC after working for Clark Construction for the past 13 years. He and his wife Donna reside in Vienna, VA along with their sons Ryan (6) and Tyler (3), perhaps a future Panther double-play combination.

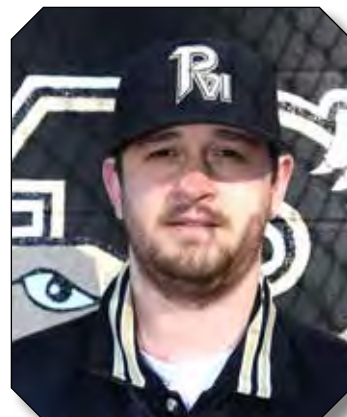

JOHN RALSTON (PVI '07)

VARSITY ASSISTANT

5th Year at PVI

John Ralston begins his fifth season back at his alma mater after finishing his collegiate career as a 4 year starting shortstop at Rider University. John led Rider to the conference playoffs all 4 years and won the 2008 and 2010 MAAC Championships. In 2011 he was named to the MAAC All Tournament Team. John also participated in 2 NCAA Regionals: 2008 Cal-State Fullerton (CSF, UCLA, UVA, Rider) and 2010 Austin (Univ. of Texas, Rice, Louisiana Lafayette, Rider).



At Rider, John holds the record for most games played, is in the top 30 for most hits and top 30 for most RBI's in program history.

While at PVI, John was a 3 year Varsity starter at shortstop, winning the 2004 State Championship and 2007 WCAC Championship. During Coach Ralston's time at PVI, the Panthers had a record of 77-17 (.819). Individually he earned 2006 WCAC 2nd Team and All-Met Honorable Mention as well as 2nd Team All-State honors in 2007.

John graduated from Rider University in May 2011 with a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting. He is a Business Analyst in the IT industry. His three siblings are also Paul VI alum. Sister Julia ('01) went on to become a volleyball All American at Marymount University, brother Gabe ('03) played baseball and football at PVI and later Lebanon Valley College and sister Maria ('08) played volleyball at The Ohio State University. Coach Ralston currently resides in Annandale, VA.

What Coach Nolan has to say about Coach Ralston: *"Coach Ralston is an outstanding coach who has a very bright future and is mature beyond his years, in coaching and in his everyday life. It's really no surprise, as he was the same way as a player, never hesitating, always a "grinder" and mentally tough, a true leader. Coach Ralston is a great teacher and a true asset to our program and our young men."*

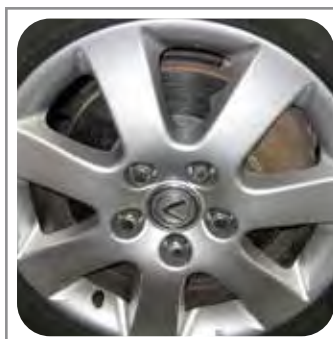

Varsity Assistant Coaches

MIKE McMENAMIN (PVI '08)

VARSITY ASSISTANT

3rd year at PVI

Mike McMEnamin enters his third season at his alma mater, returning to the Varsity level after having been the JV head coach in 2015. Before returning, Coach McMEnamin spent five years in Blacksburg, VA at Virginia Tech. During those five years Mike spent four years as the bullpen catcher for the Hokie baseball team and one year on the coaching staff. While serving as a coach, the Hokies made history with two school firsts. They appeared in the 2013 ACC Championship game and hosted an NCAA Regional in Blacksburg (Oklahoma, Coastal Carolina, Connecticut, Virginia Tech). Coach McMEnamin also participated in the 2010 Colombia Regional (Bucknell, Citadel, Virginia Tech, South Carolina). Coach McMEnamin spent two summers as an assistant coach for the Chatham Anglers of the Cape Cod Baseball League ('11, '12) honing his coaching abilities and considers it maybe his greatest baseball experience.



While at PVI, Coach McMEnamin was a 3 year Varsity letterman while starting at catcher for two of those years. Coach McMEnamin was behind the plate when the Panthers captured the 2007 WCAC Championship and the 2008 VISAA State Championship. As a 2 year starter, PVI had a record of 54-7 (.870) and finished the year nationally ranked #12 in the nation in 2008 by PGCrosschecker. Individually, Coach McMEnamin earned 2007 WCAC Honorable Mention and was a 2008 WCAC 3rd Team selection as well as 2007 2nd Team All-State pick.

Coach McMEnamin graduated from Virginia Tech in May 2013 with a Bachelor's Degree in Marketing. He does land development in the Real Estate industry. He also helps coach the Snyder Baseball Academy 13u team in the fall. His older brother, Trey ('05), is also a PVI alum and member of the 2004 Paul VI State Championship team and he played collegiately at Wingate College. Coach McMEnamin currently resides in Clifton, VA.

What Coach Nolan has to say about Coach McMEnamin:

"Coach McMEnamin, the player, was a coach on the field. It gave us an advantage which is evident in the gaudy win loss record we achieved during his two years as a starter here. Coach McMEnamin has always had an extremely high baseball IQ and this serves him extremely well in his coaching. He is the son of a great coach and has grown up in baseball. Having him return from the college coaching ranks is tremendously gratifying to me personally, and he is extremely valuable to our staff."

CHAD MORGAN (PVI '09)

VARSITY ASSISTANT

2nd year at PVI

Chad Morgan enters his second season at his alma mater after finishing his collegiate career at Virginia Tech, where he played catcher for 3 years. As catcher, Chad helped lead the Virginia Tech team to series wins over nationally ranked Florida State and UVA in 2013. That same year, the Hokies went on to roll through ACC pool play undefeated, beating UVA, Florida State, and Georgia Tech before facing UNC in the ACC Championship game. Chad played a key role in getting the Hokies to make school history in 2013, with their first ever #1 seed in the NCAA tournament where they hosted a regional in Blacksburg (Oklahoma, Coastal Carolina, Connecticut, Virginia Tech). Chad's greatest baseball memory/experience came when he spent the summer playing for the Chatham Anglers in the Cape Cod Baseball League (2012).



While at PVI, Chad was a three year Varsity letterman winning the 2007 WCAC Championship, 2008 State Championship, and 2009 WCAC & State Championships. Individually, as a junior, he earned 2008 WCAC 2nd Team Honors. During Chad's senior season he earned 2009 All-Met 1st Team Honors, WCAC 1st Team Honors, and VISAA State Player of the Year Honors. He currently holds the PVI baseball record for highest batting average, in a season (.483), and most walks during a season (24).

Chad graduated from Virginia Tech in 2013 with a B.S. in resource management. He is a business analyst in the IT industry. He has four younger brothers, three of which have played baseball at PVI or are currently playing baseball at PVI (James '10, Jack '13, Michael '17, and Will 7th grade). He currently resides in Springfield, VA.

What Coach Nolan has to say about Coach Morgan: *"Coach Morgan is a natural leader. He has been brought up in a wonderful family which has taught him a solid work ethic and great judgement. Coach Morgan was a fantastic player at Paul VI and Virginia Tech. The game came naturally to him as a player but even more so as a coach. He is a great teacher. Coach Morgan is tremendous coaching our catchers."*

JUNIOR VARSITY HEAD COACH

14th year at PVI

Billy Emerson returns to the dugout after three years away from coaching. Following a standout high school and college career that ended at George Mason University, he was drafted into professional baseball in 1994 and played for the Class 'A' Newark Buffalos of the Frontier League. In 1995 he was offered several opportunities to continue playing professional baseball but opted to complete his college degree, work as a scout for the Houston Astros while beginning a career in education and coaching.



Emerson left Madison in the summer of 2002 to become Head Coach at Paul VI. His 10 seasons at PVI were extremely successful, yielding an average of 22 wins per season, 3 Washington Catholic Athletic Conference Championships, 4 VISAA State Championships, and multiple national rankings. He is the all-time leader in coaching wins at PVI with a record of 219-86 (.718), and has an overall head coaching record of 240-125 (.658). He has been named "Coach of the Year" by the WCAC (twice), The Washington Post, The Washington Examiner, the Washington DC Homeplate Club, the VISAA (twice), and was one of 8 finalists for Baseball America National Coach of the Year in 2008. His players garnered numerous All-Conference, All-State, and All-Met honors along the way, including Academic All-State selections, as well as the 2008 and 2009 State Player of the Year selections. Emerson has guided dozens of his student-athletes to college and professional baseball in the past 20 years, including 60 players at PVI alone.

Billy spent seven summers in the Clark Griffith Collegiate Baseball League as an Assistant Coach, Manager, and General Manager. From 2006-2009 he managed 315 games (high school and collegiate combined), winning 226. Emerson was the only coach in America to guide a nationally ranked high school team and a nationally ranked collegiate team in the same year, (2008 and 2009). He also coached the "South Team" in the Mid-Atlantic High School All-Star Game from 2005-2008 and is currently an Associate Scout for the Detroit Tigers. In the summer of 2010 Emerson assumed his role as Athletic Director at PVI. Billy has been married to his wife Lisa for twenty years. The couple resides in Vienna with their children; Amanda (PVI Class of '17), Haley (PVI Class of '16), and William IV (9 years old). Emerson's father Bill is a legendary hall of fame bluegrass musician.

PVI baseball players are held to a higher set of standards and are expected to be first-class citizens, students, and gentlemen. Along with those ideals, the PVI staff feels that the purpose of high school itself is to prepare kids for college, so the purpose of our high school baseball program is to also prepare kids for college baseball. A key philosophy in the PVI Baseball Program is that academic performance strengthens athletic performance. If a player “gets it done” in the classroom, baseball will take care of itself.

Great Location

You must ask yourself, is it really worth hours of commuting every day to go to another school, when PVI has everything you want and need, right here in the middle of Northern Virginia?

Paul VI is near many major roads in Northern Virginia including routes 29, 50, 123 and 236. PVI is also less than 2 miles from I-66 and less than 5 miles from the Beltway.

Our central location is a great convenience to our students. As a high school athlete, there are many demands placed on your time all year long. Being at a school that is centrally located makes life easier by getting you home sooner. Being at PVI gives you the time you need for proper rest, family activities, homework, a social life and more.

Great Facilities

In 2004, Paul VI constructed a multi-million dollar, state of the art student activities center. The new building includes a new and larger gymnasium, new locker rooms and many other needed amenities. The addition of the new activities center gave PVI a second gym and a larger, upgraded weight room and fitness center, making the indoor facilities one of the area's best. Plans are in the works to upgrade the outdoor facilities in just a few short years.

Along with the changes to the school building, many recent improvements to Panther Field (the home of PVI baseball) have allowed Paul VI to provide the finest baseball facility in the area for its players, thus creating an exciting and professional environment to practice and play. **Home crowds regularly fill the bleachers around the complex!**

The Panther Field Baseball Complex includes:

- A fully enclosed Major League size field with seating for over 2500 fans.
- Professional grounds maintenance by *Game Day Inc.*, providing the top natural Bermuda grass and Camden Yards dirt playing surface in the area.
- A state of the art, underground irrigation and drainage system.
- Batting practice "turtle" and array of professional screens.
- A 1600 square foot "press box & clubhouse" facility directly behind home plate with lockers, storage space and a coaches office.
- An upgraded sound system for announcing and music.
- An enlarged home dugout with large benches, bat rack, helmet rack and adequate equipment space.
- Two 90' x 20' artificial turf batting and pitching facilities.
- Multiple hitting stations set up to accommodate 20 hitters at one time.

Panther Field is the only on-campus home field in the WCAC with lights!

Paul VI is one of only two schools in the conference able to host a night game. Already one of the finest baseball facilities in the metropolitan area, with the help of annual fundraising and dedicated volunteers, Panther Field will be one of the nation's best in just a few short years. **Plans for a reconfigured artificial turf facility are in the works!**

More Games equals More Experience... On a Higher Level

The PVI Baseball Program plays as many games as any program in the area. Including scrimmages and post-season play, the Varsity team can play over 35 games every year. After the regular season, the Varsity plays in the WCAC Tournament at the University of Maryland's Shipley Field. Plus, if the Varsity finishes in the top eight of the Virginia Independent Schools Athletic Association (VISAA) Poll, they advance to the VA State Tournament for a chance to play at Richmond's historic Shepherd Stadium. **The Panthers have won 4 State Championships and 3 WCAC Titles in the past 12 seasons along with being nationally ranked in 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009 and 2010. PVI's astounding record of 274-115 (.704) is evidence that PVI has played and won more games than any other area program from 2003 to 2014.**

The JV team schedules at least 20 regular season contests per year (along with 3 to 4 scrimmages). That equates to at least seven more games than area public school J.V. will play. **The JV has played and won as many games as any other area JV team since 2003 with a record of 185-63.**

The quality of opponents at PVI is very high. As a member of the Washington Catholic Athletic Conference (WCAC), the Panthers always face a challenging conference schedule. PVI Baseball also schedules some of the best non-conference opponents from the Washington Metropolitan Area. **The varsity team travels to Florida and/or South Carolina, and this year Southern California, during spring break for additional non-conference games. Our fundraising program covers the expense of our trip.**

Within the WCAC from 2003 to 2015:

- ❑ Seven of the WCAC's 10 teams have been ranked in the *Washington Post* Top 10.
- ❑ All Three WCAC Virginia teams have been ranked in the *VISAA* Top 5, PVI 11 out of 12 years, O'Connell, 5 times, Ireton 2 times.
- ❑ Four WCAC teams have been Nationally Ranked by *USA Today*, *ESPN-RISE* and/or *Baseball America*, PVI, St. Johns, DeMatha and Good Counsel

The high level of competition not only makes you a better baseball player, it also draws the attention of college coaches and Major League scouts.

Other facts demonstrating our strength of schedule include:

- ❑ Multiple games (annually) against Nationally Ranked opponents.
- ❑ Multiple games (annually) against *Washington Post* Top 10 opponents.

"The Way"

A Winning Approach

Playing baseball at Paul VI Catholic High School gives you the "total package". It's something we like to call "The PVI Way".

At PVI we make a year-round effort for our program and our players. Although the coaching staff encourages participation in other sports at PVI, there are opportunities for baseball players to improve all year through team baseball camps and baseball specific weight training & conditioning. In other words, we have all the camps you need. The staff also monitors the academic progress of baseball players throughout the school year. Our high school program is more like a college program. The idea is to prepare you for the next level. **Those who plan to participate in other sports, are not disadvantaged or looked down upon by missing off-season baseball activities. We encourage multi-sport athletes.**

Our off-season conditioning program runs from late November through the start of baseball season and focuses on flexibility, cardiovascular strength & endurance, muscular strength & endurance, speed, plyo-metric power and nutrition. The coaching staff is well educated in the latest techniques to improve athletic performance. From late November through late February the PVI Baseball Staff coordinates camps for the players at local indoor baseball facilities. Players have a chance to improve skills with the coaching staff and prepare themselves for the upcoming season. In the summer, the staff co-coordinates at least 1-2 weeks of baseball camps in order for players to once again improve skills in the presence of PVI coaches and college coaches. The staff also produces a master schedule of PVI players' summer teams and makes regular visits to summer games.

The staff monitors academic progress year round through communication with the Dean of Academics and regular checks by the head coach on the school's intranet grading system. Players are typically referred to tutors and teachers who provide assistance if necessary. A major emphasis is placed on the idea of academic performance strengthening athletic performance. Players often attend after-school study hall with the coaching staff throughout the course of the season. This not only gives the players extra-time for schoolwork, it also further emphasizes our philosophies. The Principal, the Dean of Students and the Dean of Academics also visit the players once a year during practice to make sure each student-athlete fully understands the expectations of the institution.

Coaches meet with players before the season to set roles and goals. Following the each season, players have a post season meeting with coaches to set new goals. The idea is to continue successes and improve upon weaknesses. Coaches also meet with players and parents to discuss college options. The coaching staff provides information on college recruiting, NCAA rules & standards and a realistic expectation for all interested players. The coaching staff is in constant contact with colleges throughout the country to ensure that every player who wants to go to the next level can get there.

"The PVI Way" takes high school baseball to a new level. The PVI coaching staff brings a collegiate approach and a professional approach to the program. The high standards, academic monitoring, personal interest in each player, study halls, off-season conditioning and organized practices mirror the protocol for college baseball. Players are told "If you want to be a pro, act like one now". On that accord, our coaching staff makes every effort to run a program on a professional level. Although well experienced, the coaching staff is always looking for professional development opportunities. By attending clinics and collaborating with other high school coaches, college coaches and professionals, the PVI Staff focuses on properly teaching fundamentals with the latest techniques and the finer nuances of the game.

Section 6

A Staff with Experience, Integrity & Connections

Now in his 14th year within the PVI program, **Head Coach Jeff Nolan** and his staff have established PVI Baseball as one of the most successful and respected programs in America. He is highly respected, nationally and specifically for his work with pitchers, helping win 12 Championship Titles in the past 12 seasons and assisting 66 student-athletes to college baseball (32 NCAA Division I). Coach Nolan was named **Mid-Atlantic High School Assistant Coach of the Year in 2009 after being a finalist for the award twice previously. He was selected WCAC Coach of the Year in 2014.** Nolan has over 25 years of coaching experience following a playing career that ended with an NCAA National Championship under the "College Coach of the Century"; John Scolinos. Over the years, Coach Nolan has been heavily involved with college placement and has coached college summer wood bat baseball in the Clark Griffith League.

Paul VI has maintained assembled an amazing group of assistants for years. **Infield Coach Tad Davidovich (14th year)** has Division I playing experience, has coached on the National Level in AAU, and also collegiately. Other assistants at the JV and Varsity levels bring years and years of high level playing and coaching experience to the program. Two members of the staff have been together for ten or more years. And the program features three alumni (former players) who have returned to coach at Paul VI after college and professional baseball careers. Mike McMenamin, (Class of 2008) a former All Conference (3rd Team) catcher and member of the Virginia Tech Coaching Staff two years ago, Chad Morgan, begins his second year coaching the Panthers' catchers after completing his collegiate career as a catcher at Virginia Tech. John Ralston (Class of 2007), Rider University Shortstop) serves the varsity staff as 3rd base coach after being the head coach of the Junior Varsity team. **Consistency breeds success!**

The baseball staff is loaded with professionals who take their positions very seriously and realize the impact that their actions and decisions make on young lives. The staff also believes in the principles of a Catholic Education and focuses on using baseball as a tool to teach important life lessons. The coaches strongly believe in a wholesome, family atmosphere. Players at PVI aren't simply looked at as baseball players; they are members of a family and each member is just as important as the next. Success off the field is clearly evident as well. Grade point averages rise as rapidly as winning percentages and the Panthers have built a reputation as a dedicated, respectful and hard working group of young men.

Recruitment and the Transfer Rule

Active recruiting of pre-high school students is permitted by the WCAC. The coaching staff cannot approach a student who has already enrolled in high school unless the student or his parents have contacted the school or coaches first.

TRANSFER RULE- After August 15th prior to the student-athlete's sophomore year, any student who was previously enrolled in another high school DC, MD or VA will not be eligible to participate at the Varsity level for one calendar year. The student will be permitted to play JV if he is a junior or younger. The transfer rule does have an appeal/waiver process for extenuating circumstances.
