## 8:13:1

## Open Senior Membership period

A majors player has a birth date of August 31, which is the cutoff for determining your "Little League" age. If the player was born a few hours later, he would have an extra year of eligibility. Under the current rules, he is a 12-year-old for the 2019 season. The father attended the



meeting to ask the board if anything could be done, noting that his son has spent his entire Little League career playing with that younger age group. It is pointed out to the father that his best course of action would be to make a formal petition and send it to Little League. The board approved a motion to support the petition if one is created.

## Improving level of play at Double-A

A lot of discussion ensues on how to improve the level of play at Double-A. Pat Goonan notes that the talent was not evenly distributed between the teams last season. The board discusses options for creating an even playing field for next season, which will limit the stacking of players



and coaches. There is also talk of switching the format. Should the coaches pitch the first three innings? Other members think instructional videos on coaching kids at that level should be posted, with a requirement for all coaches to watch. Discussion is tabled for a future meeting.

## Raising fee to play

Discussion ensues on whether the league should make a significant increase in the cost of play to support major future projects and renovations at the complex. Several on the board argue that families need to see this work get done before they should have to pay a higher fee per player. Keith Barry hands out an estimate from contractors to excavate the hill, expand the parking lot and build a retaining wall approximately 250 linear feet, 8 feet high and 20 feet deep. Some board members would like a capitol campaign to raise money for this endeavor. Rich Myers suggests making a proposal to Roche Brothers.

The board approves a motion for a small increase for Triple-A and Majors players only. Majors and AAA go from \$190 to \$200. AA-remains \$190. A and T-Ball remain at \$150. First sibling gets a reduction of \$50. Second sibling gets a reduction of \$100. Third sibling gets a reduction of \$150.
