Juniors

- 1. Time Limits: All games have a two and a half hour time limit. No new innings to start after two hours and one half hours. Game length will be seven innings with a regulation game complete after 5 innings or 4.5 with home team winning.
- 2. Games that do not reach 4.5 or 5 innings will be replayed from the beginning on the next available date including Sundays. Pitch counts from incomplete game are still in effect.
- 3. Any of the starting nine may withdrawal and re-enter once provided such player occupies the same batting position whenever he is in the lineup. A substitute withdrawn may not re-enter. A local rule option is continuous batting order with unlimited substitutions. Every player must start once a week.
- 4. The batter can strikeout, walk or take a base if hit by pitch. Dropped third strike rule applies. If a runner walks toward the dugout outside the clay the batter is out.
- 5. A pitcher who delivers 41 or more pitches in a game can't play catcher for the remainder of the day.
- 6. Courtesy runner is allowed for pitcher and catcher. That courtesy runner will be the last recorded out if a continuous batting order is used. Otherwise only bench players can run. . Base runners must avoid contact. Head first sliding allowed.
- 7. Umpires will be provided for this division and will include one plate and one field umpire.
- 8. Pool players may be used if a manager is short players. The pool player list will be kept by the division manager and or player agent. The player selected will be the next available from the list. Guest players must bat last and may not allowed to pitch or play catcher.
- 9. Babe Ruth Cal Ripken rules apply if not addressed in local rules.
- 10. Teams will compete in a end of the season tournament to crown a champion, Teams will play 2 pool play games then advance to a single elimination bracket. Rules for seeding our as follows.
- 1. win loss record
- 2. fewest runs allowed
