# How Did the Regional Winners Fare in the W.S.?



8-year-old player pitch W.S. held in Cherry Hill (NJ) - The majority of the teams in this World Series were from our region. The regional champion was Pennsbury (SEPA). Most of sixteen teams in the this were from the tournament Middle Atlantic Region. Pennsbury went undefeated in both the pool play and bracket phases and won the World Series. Upper Allen (PA) came in 2<sup>nd</sup>, Brandywine (PA) came in 3<sup>rd</sup> and Cherry Hill National (SNJ) came in 4<sup>th</sup>.

There were no MAR teams in the **8-year-old machine pitch** tournament.

9-year-old W.S. held in Jensen Beach (FL) – There were two Middle Atlantic teams in this tournament. The regional champion was Lower Dauphin (NWPA). They were 1 and 1 in pool play giving them the 7 seed in the bracket. They won their first game but were then lost their next two bracket games.

The other representative was Quakertown (PA). They were 2-0 in pool play and became the 6<sup>th</sup> seed. They won their first bracket game but then lost their next two bracket games.

**10-year-old W.S. held in Phenix City (AL)** – Hamilton (NJ) was the regional winner. They were 0 and 3 in pool play giving them the 4<sup>th</sup> place in their pool. In the bracket phase they were 2-1 in the Championship bracket then lost and were eliminated in their first game in the Iron Man bracket.

11/70 held in Jensen Beach (FL) – Flood City (PA) was the regional winner. They were 1 and 1 in pool play giving them the 5<sup>th</sup> place in their pool. In the Championship bracket phase, they went 1 and 2. This put them in 4<sup>th</sup> place overall in the World Series.

**12/60** held in Visalia (CA) – Waynesboro (PA) was the regional winner. They went 2 and 3 in pool play giving them the 5<sup>th</sup> place in the National Division. They won their first game in the single elimination bracket beating Minnesota but then lost their second game to Washington and were eliminated.

**12/70 held in Branson (MO)** – East Fishkill (NY) was the regional winner. In pool play their record was 1 and 3 making them the 5<sup>th</sup> place entry in Pool A. They were eliminated in the single elimination bracket by Connecticut.



**13-year-old held in Westfield** (MA) – The regional winner was Centre County (PA). They had a pool play record of 1 win and 3 loses and did not advance to the bracket phase.

**14-year-old held in Demopolis** (AL) – The regional winner was Broomall-Newtown (PA). They had a 3 and 1 record in pool play which gave them 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the Tombigbees Division. They won their first bracket game but then lost to Florida. This made them one of the two third place winners in the World Series.

**13-15 held in Bismarck (ND)** – Millville (NJ) was the regional winner. They had a pool play record of 1 win and 3 loses and did not advance to the bracket phase.

**16-18 held in Mobile (AL)** – Onondaga (NY) was the regional winner. They had a pool play record of 2 and 2 which gave them the 3<sup>rd</sup> place position in the National Division. They were eliminated in their first bracket game by Massachusetts.



**8U W.S. held in Jensen Beach** (**FL**) – The regional winner was Allentown (SNJ) however they did not go to the W.S. Our region was represented by Delran (NJ). They went 1-1 in pool play and made it to the winners' bracket semifinals before losing to Manassas Blue and Gray. This forced them into the loser bracket where they lost to the eventual champion Oviedo.

There were no MAR teams in the **10U** tournament.

12U W.S. held in Jensen Beach (FL) – The regional champion was Egg Harbor Township (SNJ). They were 3-1 in pool play want went into the best of three championship series. They won their first game over Buffalo (NY) but lost game two but came back to win game 3 to win the 12U W.S. title.

There were no MAR teams in the **14U** tournament.

16U W.S. held in Jensen Beach (FL) – The regional champion was Vineland (SNJ). They went 0-5 in pool play with a mixmashed team due to departures of several of their starters to play travel ball.

The second Middle Atlantic team in the tournament was Waretown (SNJ). They went 1-4 in pool play and lost in the Diamond Championship to the Raynham Rockets.

There were no MAR teams in the **18U** tournament. ◆
