Our dear friend and sister in Christ, Ramona Marshall died in her sleep on October 30. She was 97. We will miss her. I will miss her. You served with her on the Deacons Board and in PW. The last week of her life, Ramona told one of our deacons that she missed being at church with us. I always enjoyed visiting with her. She had a wonderful sense of humor. I'm sure we will all be sharing stories of how she made us laugh.

Ramona's faith remained strong. She frequently said that she was praying for the church. One of the first things she always asked me was, "How was the church?" She wanted to know if we'd had any visitors. She looked forward to listening to the weekly worship services on tape and to sharing communion. On my last visit with her, she told me that she was not afraid to die. She knew she'd be with God.


I would love to mention the names of the people in our congregation who were particularly close to Ramona, but the truth is she was well-loved by everyone. Many of you visited her regularly at Flippo's Carefree Living. The deacons visited her weekly and made sure she received home communion whenever we celebrated communion.

I'd like to close with this story. Ramona said that she was sitting with the residents' in the TV room at Flippos. Everyone was quiet. She looked around at all the faces and thought to herself with a grin, "Who's going to be the first one to dance?" I know she's dancing now.

Obituary

Ramona M. Marshall, age 97was born May 17, 1915, in Kankakee, Illinois to Alexander and Amanda Hess Jennette. She married Verne Salter in 1942, he died in 1972. She was married to Verle Heinis in 1974 until his death. She Married John Marshall in 1983, and he died in 1984.

Mrs. Marshall was a former 28-year employee of City National Bank in Kankakee. She retired from First National Bank in Bullshoals, Arkansas. She also owned and operated a fishing resort on the White River in Flippin, AR. She was a graduate of St. Paul Lutheran School, Graduate of Kankakee High School, and Gallagher Business College. She was a member of Presbyterian Church of Bull Shoals, where she was a Deacon and Board Member. She was a volunteer at Baxter Medical Hospital. She is survived by three nieces Judythe Jennette-Lea, Marlene Townsend, Kathy Klausner all of California and a nephew Mark Jennette of Nevada. She was buried at Friday, November 9 in Kankakee Memorial Gardens Cemetery. Memorials may be made to the Donors Choice.





They love Dinah and give her gifts that are to sustain her through a hard—working youth, a calling to midwifery, and a new home in a foreign land. Dinah's story reaches out from a remarkable period of early history and creates an intimate, immediate connection. Deeply affecting, The Red Tent combines rich story—telling with a valuable achievement in modern fiction: a new view of biblical women's society."


WHAT IS THE CHRISTMAS JOY OFFERING?



<u>RECIPES</u>

Christmas Chocolate Bark



Ingredients

- 2 cups dark chocolate chips
- 1/3 cup pistachios (mine were unsalted)
 1/3 cup dried cranberries
- 1/2 teaspoon coarse sea salt

Directions

- 1. In a small saucepan over very low heat, melt chocolate
- Pour chocolate into a parchment paper lined 8x8 inch Pyrex baking dish
- 3. Sprinkle pistachios and cranberries over chocolate
- 4. Using a metal spatula, spread the mixture evenly back and forth to around $\frac{1}{2}$ inch thickness
- 5. Sprinkle salt over bark
- 6. Allow to sit out until set, 1-2 hours
- 7. Cut into 16 squares and serve.
