IN MEMORY OF A BELOVED MEMBER

Warren Heydt April 8, 1916 - June 9, 2011



A funeral service for Warren Heydt of Bull Shoals, AR will be 10:00 a.m. Tuesday June 14, 2011 at Bull Shoals Presbyterian Church with Reverend Terry Hart officiating. Warren died June 9, 2011 at Hospice House of the Ozarks surrounded by his family. He was 95 years old. Warren was born April 8, 1916 in New Brunswick, NJ to Percy and Pearl Lippmann Heydt. He was a veteran of World War II, beginning his Army service in 1942. He married Eleanor Olson, his beloved wife of 68 years, in 1943 prior to being shipped overseas and assigned to the 1st Infantry Division, 18th Infantry Regiment. Involved in the Battle of the Bulge, he fought in France, Germany and Czechoslovakia. He was awarded the Bronze Star and Purple Heart and achieved the rank of Battalion Sgt Major.

Following WWII, Warren attended Agricultural and Technical College at Morrisville, NY. After graduation he moved with his family to Massapequa, Long Island, NY where he commuted daily to his management job with the New York City Transit Authority. He was an avid gardener, photographer, carpenter and landscaper. Warren was a dedicated member of the Presbyterian Community Church as Elder, Clerk of Session, and head of the Finance Committee. In 1985 Warren and Eleanor retired to Bull Shoals, AR, where he added boating and fishing to his favorite hobbies and continued his membership and service at Bull Shoals Presbyterian Church.

Warren is survived by his son, Richard Heydt (Lynda) of Bull Shoals; daughters, Judith Heydt Luetzen of Bull Shoals, and Carolyn Heydt of Longmont, CO; grandchildren, Kelly Nicholson (Nick), Beth Truitt (Jon), Ken Gooley (Leontine), Kirk Heydt (Kristin), Peter Heydt (Elisse), and Mark Heydt (Jolene); great-grand children, Matthew, Timothy, Jade and Kennedy; and a very large number of nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his wife Eleanor, his brother Kenneth Heydt; two grandchildren, Karin Suzanne Heydt and Erik Richard Heydt, and one great-grandchild, Kaylee Breanne Gooley. Visitation will begin at 9:30 a.m. prior to the funeral. Burial will be in Kirby's Tucker Memorial Cemetery. Memorials may be made to the Bull Shoals Presbyterian Church. Arrangements are by Kirby & Family Funeral & Cremation Services.

Trinity Presbyterian, Little Rock Hosts 117th Stated Meeting of Presbytery

Important Information or Changes Made...June 4, 2011

- -Limit presentation, discussion and debate on the constitutional amendment for the new Form of Government section of the Book of Order.
- -Approve increase in terms of Rev. David Schaller at Faith, Horseshoe Bend.
- -Concur with dissolution of call of Rev. Emmett Powers with First, Lonoke and his terms as interim pastor at First, Jonesboro
- -Approve terms of Rev. Guy Delaney as interim pastor at First, Little Rock.
- -Elect four people to fill unexpired terms on committees and concur with election by Ferncliff Board of a person to fill an unexpired term on board.
- -Concur with dissolution of Rev. Steve Merrin's relationship with First, Fort Smith.
- -Enroll Molly McGinnis, a member of Westminster, Hot Springs, as an inquirer into ministry.

CHANGES VOTED TO BOOK OF ORDER AS REFERRED BY GENERAL ASSEMBLY:


-Approved the proposed new Form of Government section of the Book of Order (This amendment is currently being voted on by presbyteries across the denomination and will only be included in the next Book of Order if approved by a majority of presbyteries.)

PRESBYTERY FINANCIAL/PERSONNEL REPORT VOTED OR READ:

- -Vote to raise the spend rate to 5.5% this year if needed.
- -Recognition of generosity of churches in their giving, acknowledgement of financial shortfall and decision to ask committee moderators to reduce spending by 20% of the 2011 budgeted amounts.
- -Review of insurance policies and financial audit for 2010 and financial reports for April, 2011
- -Plan for replacing Presbytery and Financial Administrator by a combination of Texas Presbyterian Foundation involvement in financial services, in-house staff involvement of the Communications Director who becomes Director of Mission Support and assumes financial responsibilities, with other committee, reports and assistance redistributed to current staff, compensation/other costs, resulting in sizeable savings.

- -Order of the Day led by Stated Clerk of the PC(USA) on the proposed amendment on the new Form of Government
- -The need for flood buckets and the challenge to congregations by Committee on Disaster Preparation and Response to fill and return buckets to the October 14-15 meeting of presbytery.
- -Farewell, thanks and gifts to retiring Presbytery and Financial Administrator Pauline Rhodes.
- -A new scholarship beginning in 2012 for PC(USA) students for ½ tuition at Lyon College, Batesville.
- -Toney D. McMillan Vocational Discernment Fund.
- -Surveys on pilot project from Care and Nurture of Church Professionals for church professionals dealing with loss of spouse or incidence of cancer or Alzheimer's.
- -Continuing work of the background check policy subcommittee of Committee on Ministry.
- -Tribute to Rev. David Dyer of Little Rock who retires on July 31.

The book of the month is WAKING THE DEAD by John Eldredge.

"Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life.

" Proverbs 4:23

"How has this central truth been lost...that the heart is the center of human life? It is the creative powerhouse within you. It is the connecting point between you and others--between you and God. In fact, the heart is where we receive that life God offers and we long for--a life flowing through us, as Jesus said, in rivers. And it is through your heart that God wants to change the world. In WAKING THE DEAD, John Eldredge shows us how God restores our hearts, our true humanity, and sets us free.

There are four streams, Eldredge says, through which we can discover the abundant life: Walking with God, Receiving His Intimate Counsel, Deep Restoration, and Spiritual Warfare. And once the "eyes of our hearts" are opened, we will embrace three eternal truths:

Things are not what they seem.

This is a world at war.

Each of us has a crucial role to play.

A battle is raging. And it is a battle for your heart.

"Good Christian words sometimes get lost. The good word "evangelism," which carries so much baggage, is virtually unusable. When did it become a dirty word? Probably about the time too many well-meaning, but misguided Christians whacked people over the heads with their Bibles in an attempt to intimidate them into the kingdom of heaven! It actually happened two summers ago on a street corner in Austin, Texas. An earnest young man holding Christian tracts struck up a conversation with a passerby outside an ice cream parlor to try to convince him of the need to reform his wayward life--even persisting after the passerby assured him that he was a Christian, fully prepared to enter not only heaven but also ordained ministry.

Words aren't the only things to get lost. People get lost too. Whacking people over the head with our Bibles is not an effective way to build God's kingdom; nevertheless, the work of every Christian to reach out to others with the good news is never done. First & Calvary Presbyterian Church in Springfield, Missouri, spent almost a year of careful prayer and discussion, culminating in the "Each One, Reach One" campaign, which emphasizes the need for each First & Calvary member to invite at least one person to one church event at some point during the next year. Resolving to do that with hospitality and warmth, rather than hostility and whacking, they, like Jesus, will enter into the lost and found business and challenge us to do the same.



RECIPES

Tangy Glazed Chicken

From recipes.com



Ingredients - This recipe serves 2 people - "Serve with potato's or rice and a salad"

- 2 boneless chicken breasts
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 4 1/2 teaspoons butter or margarine
- 1 small onion, thinly sliced
- 1 celery rib, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 1/2 cup apple jelly
- 3 tablespoons orange juice
- 1 tablespoon minced fresh parsley
- 1/4 teaspoon dried thyme

Directions

Sprinkle chicken with salt if desired. In a large skillet, melt butter over medium heat; brown chicken on all sides. Remove and keep warm. In the pan drippings, saute onion and celery until tender. Add the remaining ingredients; cook and stir until jelly is melted. Return chicken to pan. Cook, uncovered, for 30-35 minutes or until meat juices run clear. Remove skin if desired. Top chicken with onion mixture.
