У From the Dom's Heart

Preacher Harold Camping, President of Family Radio of California, predicted the world would come to an end on May 21, 2011. You have probably guessed by now that his prediction was incorrect.

and visitors must have felt their world had come to an end. The deadliest tornado to ever hit a Missouri town devastated a six mile long stretch of heavily populated and commercially prosperous territory. The death toll, at the time to you - to love you more than anyone or anyof writing this article stood at 125 with hundreds of injured and missing. Homes were flattened and businesses were destroyed. A hospital in completely inoperable.

As I watched the news, I witnessed many who praised God for their safety. Others said that they were "lucky" to be alive. Some counted it a blessing to be alive although they had lost everything. Some were bitter about their loss even though they were alive.

These reactions from victims are typical. During my years as MBC Disaster Relief Director, I heard it all. One thing is for sure, a crisis separates the believers from the unbelievers. You can really get a sense of the difference Christ makes in a believer's heart and life.

I wonder how each of us would initially respond to a disaster of Joplin's magnitude if it the unchurched. Watch for more details to impacted us directly. Would we be as quick to praise God as some were that were interviewed by the television networks? I wonder!!

How is your relationship with God today? Are you thankful for what you have or distraught by what you do not have?

Pray for the residents of Joplin. Remember that the impact of the tornado extends far beyond the city limits. Many who work in Joplin live outside the damaged area or outside Joplin. Their place of employment is gone.

Many who live outside Joplin lost loved ones in Joplin. Joplin will never again be as it was. Many will be traumatized for the rest of their lives.

Perhaps the best prayer we can pray for A mere day later a lot of Joplin residents those inside and outside of Joplin is this, "Lord help us all to be thankful for our loved ones, our spiritual blessings and the material things you allow us to care for. But most importantly, Lord, use this tragedy to bring us all closer thing else in our lives. Help us to see that we may lose everything but that we cannot lose you! May many people come out of their rubble and grief having put their trust in your Son, Jesus Christ."

> I do hope that this crisis which literally knocked on our association's back door will be a wake up call for us and our churches. Far too many are lost in their sins. Many more are unchurched. I will be asking your church to follow the association's leadership this summer in activities designed to get the name of Jesus in some communities in our association. I will be asking our churches to join me on July 2 in Greenfield to lift up the name of Jesus at their "Celebration in the Park." In September our association will conduct a weekend revival, VBS and Carnival in the park to try to reach come.

Pray that God will put a burden in your heart for the lost and a sense of urgency to reach them with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Ask God for the privilege of joining other Christians from our association to at least prepare our counties spiritually for any disaster that may befold us.

Minutes from the OPBA Executive Board Meeting May 19, 2011

The OPBA Executive Board met on May 19, 2011 at the Mt. Nebo Baptist Church in Lockwood. The meeting opened with a hymn and prayer. The meeting was called to order by Moderator Tom Welch and a motion was made by Doris Fisher to accept the minutes of the 14th Annual Meeting as printed. Motion was seconded by Linda Welch and motion carried. James Lovercamp moved that the Treasurer's Report be accepted as printed. Motion was seconded by Steve Clark and motion carried.

Book of Reports was presented. Bro Jim Albers spoke on behalf of Matthew Keathley who was not present, in regards to the Camp Committee Report. Linda Welch spoke in regards to the VBS Report. Elwood Fisher spoke in regards to the Property Committee Report. A motion was made by Elwood Fisher to accept the reports which was seconded by James Lovercamp and was carried.

For the Nominating Committee, Linda Welch brought a motion that Robb Hodson serve as Assistant Moderator for the remainder of the current year. Motion carried.

There was no Old Business to discuss.

Under New Business, the Property Committee brought several motions by way of Harold Van De Mark as follows: 1) that the Property Committee and DOM be authorized to sell the property once belonging to the Forest Grove Baptist Church for an asking price of \$5,000 and further be authorized to negotiate the selling price if necessary. 2) that the Property Committee be authorized to repair or replace the roof on the associational office building. 3) that the Property Committee, if deemed necessary by the committee, be authorized to purchase and install a sump pump for the crawl space under the association parsonage. Each motion was discussed as needed by all present, voted on and was carried.

Also under New Business, the Missions Committee brought several motions by way of Elwood Fisher as follows: 1) That the money received from VBS curriculum purchases in the form of a rebate from LifeWay (\$174.99) and the OPBA share of Missouri Missions Offering from the MBC (\$716.49) be transferred from miscellaneous expenses to be designated to the Associational Missions fund. 2) That an annual Association Missions Offering be taken by the churches each May during Association Missions Emphasis Week for missions projects within our association beginning in 2012. 3) That the OPBA participate with a witnessing booth in the Greenfield July Celebration in the Park on July 2. 4) That the OPBA work alongside the Everton Church to sponsor a September weekend VBS, Revival and Carnival Block Party to reach the unchurched of Everton. 5) That the Missions Committee and the DOM be authorized to budget up to 40% of the total monies in the Missions budget plus the designated Associational Missions fund for the Greenfield event and up to 60% for the Everton event. 6) That the OPBA continue in 2011 to provide insurance and electricity for the Stockton Lake Chapel. Each motion was discussed as needed by all present, voted on and was carried.

Also under New Business, Aurelia Aldrich, OPBA Secretary presented an office request to purchase a new paper folding machine at the cost of \$767 for the main use of newsletters. Discussion was made on the issue. Elwood Fisher made a motion to allow purchase, James Lovercamp seconded and motion was carried.

Director of Missions, Jim Albers spoke briefly on loving God.

Moderator Tom Welch called for meeting to be adjourned with Bro. Jim Albers closing in prayer.
