“Helping First-Time Guests Become Full-Time Members” – Rev. Ted Harvey, Facilitator

In the “Engaging Your Community for Christ” Workshop we will be examining the call to take the light of the Gospel to our communities. In our time together we will examine biblical principles as well as share some practiced methods. While we are often encouraged to see the needs of the “world,” we must realize that the “world” begins at our doorstep. It's not as complicated or difficult as we may think!
