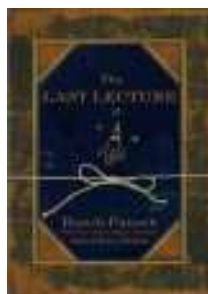
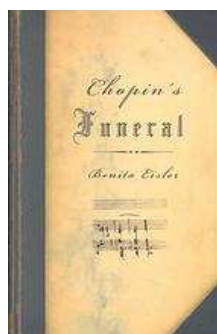

Terminally ill with cancer, computer science professor Pausch gave his “last lecture,” an inspiring exploration of lessons learned during a wonderful life. 206p.



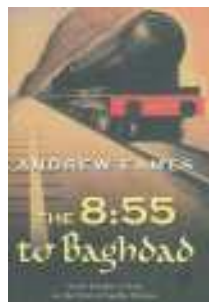

An entertaining journey through Eastern Europe and the Middle East that is part travelogue, part history, and part biography of Agatha Christie. 403p.

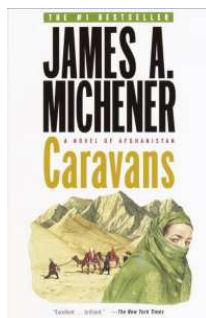

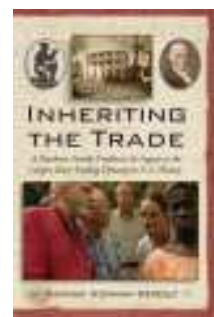

A young American woman, married and living in Afghanistan in 1946 against her parents wishes, mysteriously disappears. Elements of history, intrigue, and romance. 336p.



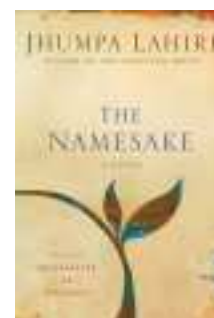

While visiting sites in North American and Africa, a group of DeWolf family descendants examines their legacy from slave traders and questions their need to make amends. 262p.

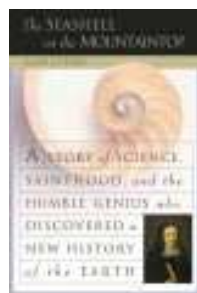
