Dear Berlin Center and Le-Valley UMC family,

I am writing this article in the midst of Easter Week. I am anticipating a new experience at our Good Friday Community service held at First United Methodist Church in downtown Ionia from 4-8 PM. We will be on a self-guided walk and time of reflection at 10 stations of the Cross. I know that I am used to a traditional church service on this day and this does take me out of my normal safe comfort zone, but let's see if we can look at the death of Christ in a new way this week.

Jesus Clears the Temple

It was nearly time for the Jewish Passover celebration, so Jesus went to Jerusalem. In the Temple area he saw merchants selling cattle, sheep, and doves for sacrifices; he also saw dealers at tables exchanging foreign money.

Jesus made a whip from some ropes and chased them all out of the Temple. He drove out the sheep and cattle, scattered the money changers' coins over the floor, and turned over their tables. Then, going Continued on the next page



Queen Esther by Ezabella Redmond

King Xerxes found favor in Esther and she became the new queen. Her cousin Mordecai sat outside the palace gates daily hoping to hear word of Esther. One day he overheard a plot to kill the king by two of his palace guards. Mordecai revealed the plot and the king's life was saved.

Easter Night on NBC

It picks up where *The Bible* miniseries left off and takes a deeper look into the Christian story, beginning with the crucifixion and the resurrection of Christ.
