From the Pastor's Pen

Dear Everybody,

The Brown's brought me back a beautiful Myrtle wood cross from Oregon. I had always heard of myrtle wood, but did not know very much about it. In doing some research, I learned that myrtle wood trees are found in Oregon and Israel.

In scripture we read from Isaiah 55: 13:

"Instead of the thorn shall come up the fir tree,

And instead of the brier shall come up the myrtle tree;

And it shall be to the Lord for a name,

for an everlasting sign that shall not be cut off."

Isaiah is prophesying growth and life instead of death and destruction. These are words of promise for us today.

The Myrtle is an evergreen tree. Its leaves are dense and wide so that you cannot see the branches. Strong roots keep the tree going even in drought and severe weather. If it is cut to a stump, the tree will sprout again because it is so hearty. The myrtle tree starts out slowly, growing only a couple of inches per year. It may grow for 120 years! Over time, several stocks may come together to make a massive trunk.

In the same way the body of Christ is one. The church becomes strong by joining together. In Romans 12:5 we read:

"...so we, though many, are one body in Christ,

and individually members of one another."

Please consider your answer to these questions:

- 1. In what ministries are we joining with others so that the message of Jesus Christ becomes a united and strong voice?
- 2. Sometimes we are cut down to almost nothing and it might appear to be the end of our story because of tragedy or misfortune, but because the roots of Christianity run deep in grace, signs of life will begin to emerge and the child of God will again grow and prosper. What would illustrate this point in your individual Christian life? Do you have a corporate illustration from our church?
- 3. We are God's people, planted in rich soil, saturated in God's holy Word, which yields a rich variety of talents and gifts. What gifts do you bring to the Body of Christ? What other gifts do you see in your church?
- 4. As the people of God we have a root system that is so thick it is like a foundation. What are the challenges we face as a church/individually to maintain this strong root system and the beautiful design of this tree?

My friends, let us be committed to living the gospel, seeking not human favor but divine approval. May we not be afraid. Let us remember it is devotion and surrender to God that we are called to live.
