The Third Article of the Apostles' Creed

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

What does this mean?

I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith. In this Christian Church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers. On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ. This is most certainly true.

From Luther's Small Catechism

ca Paul exhorts Christians to examine themselves before they receive Holy Communion (1 Corinthians 11:28). Here are five key questions to examine yourself and prepare your heart for Holy Communion:

- 1. Am I sorry for my sins and burdened by my sinful nature? Examine your life and heart in light of the Ten Commandments.
- 2. Do I believe in Jesus to forgive? Consider what God has done to give you forgiveness, which we confess in the Apostles' Creed.
- 3. Do I want God's grace to turn from sin and change? Entrust your entire life to God's mercy, as we do when we pray The Lord's Prayer.
- 4. Do I believe that Jesus body and blood are truly present in the bread and wine, as he promised?

 Examine the words of Jesus, "This is my body ... This is my blood."
- 5. Do I share the beliefs and unity of this congregation? Communing with us indicates that you share the Christian-Lutheran confession of faith.

About Holy Communion: The Lord's Supper is celebrated here in the belief and glad confidence that our Lord gives us as he says, not only bread and wine, but his very body and blood to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table baptized Christians who trust his words, repent of all sin, and forgive and love as he forgives and loves us. If you share our confession of faith, we welcome you to join us at the Lord's Table. All who have not yet received communion instruction are invited to come forward to receive a blessing, or to remain where you are and use this as a time for reflection, song or prayer. Guests who have questions about communion are encouraged to speak with Pastor Marty.
