# Information about the Eulogy:

Generally, a Burial Rite is a service that sends our loved one on to eternal life surrounded by our prayers and corporate worship. Eulogies or remembrances are most appropriate at the funeral home or wake for this reason.

If a family desires a time of spoken remembrance at the service, it should be no more than 5 minutes long—3 minutes is our usual guideline. Choose someone who will be able to get through the experience without losing composure if at all possible. Remarks should be written down and should be no longer than 2 typewritten pages. The focus on this time is to talk about the person and the extraordinary events that made them who they are. It is helpful to mention a person's faith practices if those are known.
