Website Privacy Policy

Respecting user privacy over the Internet is of utmost importance to us. This privacy policy describes the current policies and practices with regard to personal data collected and/or displayed by Trinity Y2K Childcare Center. (collectively "we," "us," "our" and herein after referred to as "Trinity Y2K") through our Website. The term "personal data" refers to personally identifiable information, such as but not limited to your name, birth date, email address, mailing address, and personal photograph that may appear on this website. "Personal data" also includes photographs of Trinity Y2K daycare events that may include pictures of registered students, Trinity Y2K staff, church members, visitors, volunteers and community members.

This privacy policy applies to information submitted by you and/or collected online by us.

Your consent

By using this website, you consent to our use of your personal data as described in this privacy policy. Your specific consent is requested upon submission of any personal data when registering your child(ren) for acceptance into any of the Trinity Y2K program services.

Notification of changes to this policy

We are continually improving and adding new functionality and features to this website. Because of these ongoing changes, changes in the law, and the changing nature of technology, we may revise this privacy policy from time to time. If and when the policy changes, we will post a dated notice on our home page informing you that a change has been made.

Use of personal data collected through this website

Information, including but not limited to personal data, that we collect will not be sold, rented, lent, exchanged or used by an individual or entity other than Trinity Y2K and the governing body of Trinity Y2K unless otherwise indicated. This includes, for example, the information you provide when you register for any of the Trinity Y2K program services, or when you send us your comments or requests for information.

We use the information you provide for the purposes for which it was originally collected, for example, to respond to your email or to provide services you requested. We may also use this information to help us improve the content and functionality of our website, to better understand the needs and interests of the people and organizations that use our website, and to improve our

programs and services. This information may be used to contact you in the future to tell you about events within Trinity Y2K and its' programs and services.

Unless we have your permission or are otherwise required by law to release, the personal data provided by you online will not be shared with other PC(USA) entities and governing bodies to enable them to contact you regarding services, benefits, or mission opportunities or with other third parties who act on our behalf to administer our website unless it is to protect the security or integrity of our databases on this website; and with our successors in interest through corporate merger, reorganization, dissolution or similar event. In the event of a release to any third party described above, your personal data will not be released until the Trinity Y2K entity, governing body, or third party has agreed in writing to be bound by the terms of this Privacy Policy.

Any destruction of personal data will be done in a manner consistent with the intent of this policy.

Anonymous data collected through this website

In addition to the information you provide when you use this website, we use technology to collect anonymous information about the use of the website. For example, we use technology to track how many visitors access the website and which pages they view.

This technology does not identify you personally. It simply enables us to compile statistics about our visitors and their use of our website. We use this anonymous data and may share it with third parties for various reasons; for example, to improve the content and functionality of the website, to better understand the needs and interests of our visitors, to improve our programs and services.

Children

We do not knowingly collect or display personal data from children under the age of thirteen through this website without the express permission of the parent(s) or legal guardian(s). If you are under thirteen, please do not give us any personal data in any areas of our website. If we develop any online programs for children in the future, we will adopt appropriate policies and practices to protect the privacy of children.
