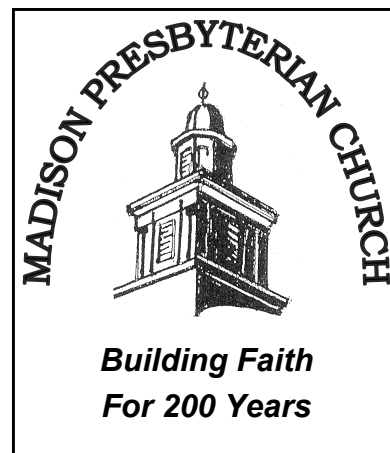

so put your trust in the Lord of all!

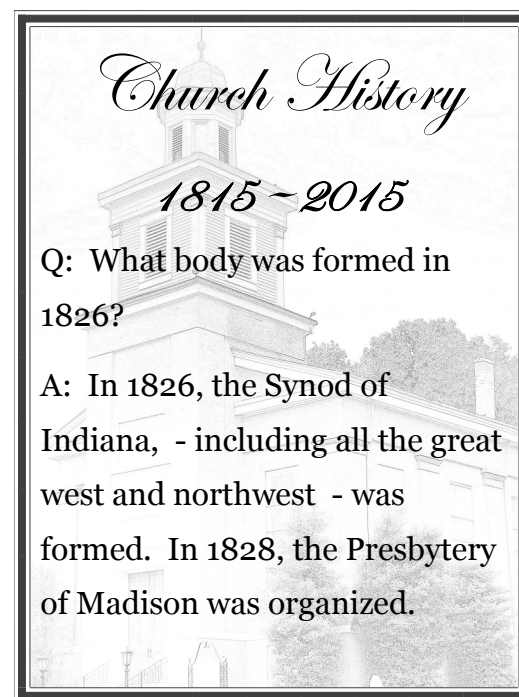
