Reflections on the Café Conversations

Several members of MPC have asked for a summary of the small group conversations about the denomination's "marriage amendment." As you remember, Madison Presbyterian invited members of the congregation to participate in a three-session conversation on related subjects.

Following, you will find some reflections and also Session's action as a result of the conversations.

The first session centered on the question of how Scripture serves as a guide for our lives.
Conversations tended to center around the question of historical context as a lens through which Scripture is best interpreted. However, we also bring our own lens of experience, tradition, and belief to a passage. These interpretive tools are important to recognize as we study Scripture.

How we weigh certain passages over others is another ongoing challenge. I think it goes without saying that no one really interprets the Bible "literally" - i.e., A.J. Jacobs, "A Year of Living Biblically." The question remains open, however, as to how we take the Bible seriously but not literally.

The second session asked how Scripture guides, nurtures, and strengthens our relationships with each other. Many comments were made about the need to be less judgmental. Scriptures often direct us to think about what Jesus would do in a similar situation.

For those less versed in Scripture, there seemed to be an orientation towards its claim on our lives to love, forgive, and be tolerant. Folks could talk eloquently and substantively about faith and relationships, even without dipping too far into Biblical texts.

The third session asked participants to draw on the previous two sessions to speak to the issue of samegender marriage. Some were open to the notion of same-gender marriage and blessing it through a

church ceremony.

Several mentioned that if two people can find love and happiness together, they should have the opportunity to seek the church's blessing on that relationship through a formal marriage ceremony.

However, there were some good questions raised and not all participants were able or willing to see the way clear for same-gender marriage in our church. By one participant that I heard, it was called a sin. Another asked a challenging question about the church's sense of obligation to sanction happiness rather than reserve the marriage ceremony for something deeper and perhaps between a man and a woman.

By my count, we had 20-25 participants. Many of the Elders were present and, thus, can share their own impressions and define a way forward.

As to the process, numerous comments were made that the format was helpful and valuable. Some want this type of forum to be used to talk about other issues. All wanted as our first priority the care and nurture of each other as we struggle with what it means to be a Christian and a Presbyterian in 2015.

At the April 15 Session meeting, the Elders expressed a desire to spend time at its May meeting looking at relevant Biblical passages.

The body felt this was an important step in discerning a way forward.

Thanks to all who participated for your openness, honesty, and commitment of time.

health and community – development activities in impoverished communities. By participating in the annual Healthy Women Healthy Families Mother's Day Project, Presbyterians not only honor important women in their lives with Mother's Day cards , but they also help provide numerous services through their donations. Included are prenatal and essential obstetric services, trauma healing and psychosocial support, and early childhood health and nutrition programs. Do know that Presbyterians are considered to be generous givers? The following is a percentage breakdown:

94% give regularly to their congregation

80% give to special appeals

40% give to special capital campaigns

33% give directly to the PC(USA) or one of its ministries

50% give to non-PC(USA) religious groups or causes

82% give to nonreligious charities, community organizations or social causes




