The Session in its meeting Wednesday, October 8, 2014:

Received a report from Al Huntington on a plan for a capital campaign to repair and upgrade the electrical system, paint the church, and restore the stained glass windows. The cost is estimated to be a total of \$150,000. The Session voted unanimously to approve this plan.

Approved unanimously a challenge budget for 2015 of \$181,000.

Received a report from Jennifer Saroka on plans for the Stewardship Campaign.

Approved a Sexual Conduct Policy as required by Presbytery. This pertains to staff and volunteers of the church.

Approved a recommendation from Personnel to add Sheri Hookey to Scott's insurance through the church.

#### **MUSICAL NOTES**

As I continued to sing through our new hymnal, Glory to God, I found another hymn, previously unknown to me, that struck me profoundly. "When the Morning Stars Together," #689, is full of beauty and drama. The text, in essence, is a retrospective of sacred music calling to mind angel hosts in stanza one, Psalms sung in synagogue and temple in stanza two, plainsong (i.e., chant), hymns and anthems in stanza three, and then a present tense dedication of our own gifts, musical (explicit) and otherwise (implied) in stanza four. I will freely admit that the musical subject of this text is likely what impressed me. I am unable to evaluate it objectively, and can only approach it from the perspective of a musician. That said. I believe the link below to a video of one of the preeminent academic choirs, St. Olaf College, presenting an arrangement of this hymn will vindicate my decision to bring it to your attention. Notice the impeccable diction and beauty of tone! I hope you enjoy it.
