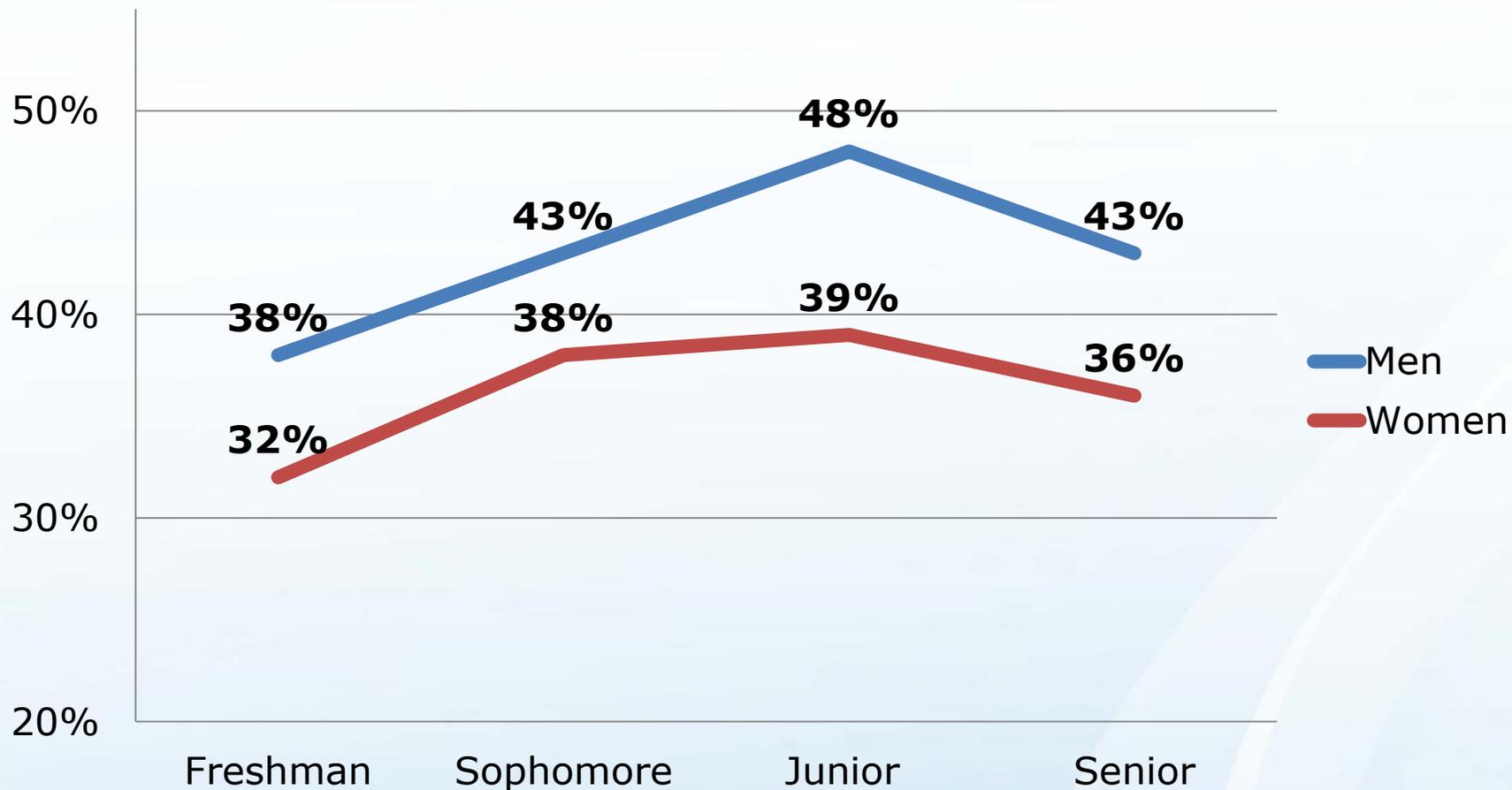

Methodology

- In 2012, the NCAA research department asked the faculty athletics representatives (FARs) at all member institutions to administer the survey (NCAA Study of Student-Athlete Social Environments) to 1-3 squads on campus.
- Stratified random sampling used to select teams that provided representative samples within sports and divisions.
- Protocols designed to standardize administration and allow participating student-athletes and institutions to remain anonymous.
- Over 21,000 NCAA student-athletes completed the survey.
- Estimated that approximately 65% of NCAA schools participated.
- Data were weighted in relation to national participation figures.
