

Police: Armed man killed after running at SWAT team

MADISON, Ohio (AP) — Ohio authorities say a SWAT team shot a man who charged at them with a gun after he barricaded himself for five hours in a home east of Cleveland.

The Lake County Sheriff's Office says the man wouldn't negotiate with authorities during the standoff and then ignored orders to drop his gun when he ran out of the home toward the SWAT officers.

They say 38-year-old Benjamin Ailstock raised his gun just before he was shot early Thursday.

The Leopold Sipe Award, named after the co-founder of the orchestra in the 1970s, will also be given to an outstanding orchestra musician. The musician's name will be etched in a plaque in the Hugh A. Glauser School of Music.

"It's a choice fellow students make for musicianship and overall contribution to the orchestra," Andrews said. "It's always a surprise. We keep it secret until the announcement."
