DID YOU KNOW? Christmas Tree Fires U.S Fire Departments responded to an estimated annual average of 230 home structure fires that began with Christmas trees in 2007-2011. These fires caused an annual average of 6 civilians, 22 civilian fire injuries, and \$18.3 million in direct property damage. When picking a tree, choose one that is fresh with green needles that do not fall off. Make sure when setting up the tree it is at least 3 feet away from any heat source. Like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents, or lights. Make sure the tree does not block an exit. Add water daily to tree stand. Use tree lights that are for indoors. Always turn off Christmas lights on tree before bed or when leaving the home. Get rid of the tree after Christmas or

Free Pizza? No, it's really Malware!

Yum! A national restaurant chain offers free pizzas to all customers, no strings attached. It sounds too good to be true, because it is! Watch out for this new email scam that comes with malware attached.

How the Scam Works:

You receive an email that appears to be from Pizza Hut. The message claims the pizza chain is celebrating its 55th anniversary by offering customers a free pizza. All you need to do is download the attached coupon and bring it into the restaurant. But don't do it! It's not a coupon, it's actually malware. Once downloaded, malware can hunt for banking and/or personal information on your computer, putting you at risk for ID theft. Emails posing as business giveaways are a popular way to transmit malware or phish for banking/personal information. Be careful of any unsolicited email that promises free gift cards or other too-good-to-be-true perks.

How to Spot a Phishing Scam:

Watch out for these signs that your email is likely a fake:

Hover over links to check their source. Place your mouse over hyper-linked text and the true destination will appear.

Don't believe what you see. scammers can easily copy a real business' colors, logo and even email address.

Be wary of unexpected emails that contain links or attachments. As always, do not click on links or open the files in unfamiliar emails.

Check the offer with a quick web search. If a business is really offering a promotional giveaway, they should be advertising it on their website and elsewhere. A quick search on Google reveals that this offer isn't real.

Watch for poor grammar and spelling. Scam emails often are riddled with typos.

Ignore calls for immediate action. Scam emails try to get you to act before you think by creating a sense of urgency. Don't fall for it.

Shopping and Returns, Oh the Headaches!

It never fails. After Christmas, before Christmas or any time, consumers return items for different reasons. Maybe they changed their mind about an item, found a better deal or worse yet found that the merchandise is broken or that pieces are missing. So long as one has a receipt to return the item, there shouldn't be any issues, right? Think again.

When purchasing a product from a retailer, if a product is defective, it may not be good enough to simply return the merchandise. One may need to deal directly with the manufacturer, and this is quite common. For example, one might go to purchase a recreational vehicle (RV) at a dealership. There are issues with the RV, and the dealership can do nothing about it directly so the consumer is referred to the manufacturer. Another instance might be in the purchase of a mattress that a retailer has for sale. The issue might be the pattern or the lumpiness of the mattress. Rather than the retailer getting involved with the manufacturer, they defer that task to you, the consumer. The same thing goes for a product sold at a local Walmart store or perhaps an HH Gregg or Best Buy. Even when purchasing a liner for a swimming pool or purchasing a replacement part for a hot tub, a consumer may be referred to deal directly with the manufacturer if it involves a warranty or defective product.

It's good to know before making the purchase what you might be getting yourself into. This makes it especially important to know what a retailer's return policy is to save yourself the potential hassle. Should you encounter issues with a retailer and are unable to work things out with the manufacturer, let the Better Business Bureau know. Potentially, this is where Better Business Bureau needs to be involved to act as a mediator, between you and the business. To file a complaint, simply call or file directly online by going to bbb.org, typing in your zip code, and clicking on the orange "File a complaint" button. From there, follow the prompts. Now that winter is upon us I'd like to touch on a topic none of us wants to think about, but is inevitable - snow. Although there is no specific ordinance governing parking on the street during snow storms, except for Bracken Parkway in Barrington Ridge, there are some things that can be done to help free traffic flow on narrow neighborhood streets in times of heavy snow. First, if you notice a car not moving after a few storms and snow is piling around it, call my office and advise the location, make, model, and plate number if possible. Chances are the vehicle is inoperable and/or has expired plates - both violations which would allow me to tag the vehicle, and if it isn't moved within a specific time frame (usually 72 hours) I can tow it. Second, even if the vehicle is operable and plated properly, sometimes your neighbors just don't realize the vehicle is causing a problem. A quick advisement by my office usually remedies the problem, the person will move the car for the plow to clear the road, and the street is freed up. All I ask is that I get notice early. It is much more difficult to verify the registration of the vehicle, tag the vehicle, and tow the vehicle after it is completely covered with hard packed snow/ice after several snow storms.
