

On 02/18/2018 at about 0220 hours I, Officer H. Richard was patrolling north on Patsy and Heather, when I observed a white SUV parked at the stop sign of Patsy and Pine Manor with the driver out of the vehicle. I approached the vehicle and I observed a white SUV bearing TX LP number JKC4445 with a white male on the driver's side slumped over as if he was intoxicated. I turned on my red and blue emergency lights, approached the white male and that is when I smelled a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The white male seen me approaching from my patrol vehicle and got back in the white SUV. I heard a distinct sound which sounded like a round being chambered into a firearm. I returned to my patrol vehicle as I pointed my on-duty hand gun at the driver's side. I asked Montgomery County Dispatch to send another unit to my location based on what I observed. Officer Valdez 2734, with the Oak Ridge North P.D, checked by my location with additional Montgomery County Units. I asked the driver of the vehicle to step out of the vehicle with his hands up. The driver was wearing all dark clothing. The driver was later identified as James Fredrick Quimby Jr, DOB x, white male. I asked the right front passenger to step out of the vehicle with his hands up and he was later identified as, Jonathan Omar Baizan, DOB x, Hispanic male. I asked the back right passenger to step out of the vehicle with his hands up and he was identified as Romeo Alexander Cuzares, DOB x, Hispanic male. All occupants was detained at that time. I found a black M&P Smith and Western hand gun with serial number Hx02 in the center console without the magazine. I asked MCSO to check the gun for stolen. MCSO advised the hand gun was not stolen. I also found one 40 cal bullet on the driver's side center console. I found one magazine wedged in the driver's seat and center console that was loaded with fourteen 40cal hollow point bullets. I found a clear baggie with a green leafy substance on the center console. I tested the green leafy substance with an (E) NIT TEST KIT and the test showed positive for marijuana. While searching Quimby I found a black left gun holster. Quimby stated that he carries his gun in that holster and upon me arriving he took it out of the holster and unloaded it. I read each occupant their Maranda warning and asked Quimby whose gun and marijuana is this? Quimby stated, "Both the gun and marijuana is mine." I placed Quimby in custody for Possession of marijuana and Unlawful Carry of a weapon at 0229 hours. Both passengers was released from the scene on foot. Quimby's vehicle was towed by Rickey's Wrecker and stored at 9131 Hwy 242 in fair condition. Quimby was transported to Montgomery South County for booking.

The marijuana was weighed by an Ohaus Dial-O-Gram scale, and showed a weight of 5.3 grams.

I called the on-duty ADA and he accepted charges for Quimby for Penal Code 481.121 Possession of Marijuana <2 OZ and Penal Code 46.02 UNL Carrying Weapon.

Both the hand gun and marijuana were placed in the Oak Ridge North evidence room.

While on patrol at approx. 11:40 PM on 02-19-2018 I, Sgt Barry, was sitting on Lake Robins at IH-45 W. Feeder. I was watching traffic and saw a vehicle northbound in the 27600 Blk of the IH-45 W. Feeder, approaching my location at a high rate of speed in the left lane. I confirmed the speed using a Pro Lidar 4 at 60 MPH, where the highest posted speed limit is 45 MPH. As the vehicle passed my location I saw it was a red 2015 Nissan Versa, with Texas license plate JGT1452. I ran the license plate as the vehicle entered IH-45 southbound main lanes. The plate return showed the motor vehicle registration had expired Jan. 2018 and the insurance was unconfirmed, no vehicle coverage found. I stopped the vehicle in the 26400 Blk of the IH-45 main lanes on the right shoulder. I approached on the driver's side and made contact with the driver, a B/M. I asked for his driver's license and insurance. The driver looked in his wallet and then stated he didn't have a driver's license. I asked him if he didn't have it with him or was it suspended. He stated he thinks it is suspended. I asked for some form of ID and he gave me a Social Security card with the name Donathan Alfonso Landry. Landry stated his DOB was x. While talking to Landry I could see, in plain view, a green leafy substance, I know to be marijuana, from my training and experience as a Police Officer, in the front pocket of his black hoodie. I returned to my patrol unit and asked for a second unit to check by my location. While waiting, I found Texas driver's license # 2x3 for Landry. Landry's driver's license was not eligible for the following suspensions:

I contacted the ADA on duty and he accepted the charge of DWLI, enhanced, a Class B Misdemeanor. Landry could not show proof of financial responsibility at the time of the stop.

Officer Stafford arrived and I asked Landry to exit the vehicle. I arrested Landry and placed him in handcuffs. I checked Landry's hoodie pocket but it was empty. I asked Landry where the marijuana was and he stated he didn't have any. I advised Landry that I saw the marijuana in his hoodie pocket and he stated no. Landry was placed in the rear seat of my patrol unit.

I then made contact with the W/F passenger, who identified herself by Texas driver's license # x as Sara Jo Rooney, DOB x. I asked Rooney to exit the vehicle. When Rooney walked to the back of the car, I could see a bulge in the rear of her pants just below her waist. I also saw a small bulge in front of her pants below her waist. Rooney had on tight jeans and it was obvious there was something under

her jeans. I asked Rooney if she had anything on her person that should not be there. Rooney stated yes, but it is not hers. I asked her to remove it. Rooney reached into her pants and pulled out a bag of green leafy substance; that later tested positive for marijuana, using a NIC field test kit. It was later weighed at 14.5 grams. Rooney then removed another bag from the front of her pants that had 11 individually packaged zip lock baggies containing white powder. This substance later tested positive for cocaine, using NIC field test kit. Rooney then removed another small zip-lock bag from her right shoe that had white powder in it. Rooney was handcuffed and placed in the back of Officer Stafford's vehicle. Rooney had blood shot eyes and a smell of an alcoholic beverage about her breath and person. She stated that she had Landry drive her home because she had too much to drink to be driving. I advised Rooney of her Miranda warning and asked her if she understood and wished to talk with me. Rooney stated she understood and would talk to me. Rooney advised that after I identified Landry and returned to my car, he asked her to hold the drugs. Rooney stated she did not know what he gave her from his hoodie but knows he sells marijuana. Rooney stated that Landry stated they would go easy on her if the drugs were found. Rooney stated she took the drugs and concealed them in her pants.

I contacted the ADA again and advised him of what I had. He accepted Man/Del of a Controlled Substance on Landry. I then started an Oak Ridge North wrecker call. Ricky's Wrecker got the tow. I asked him to bring the car to the Shell station at Sawdust Rd so I could do an inventory at a safer location. I followed Ricky's Wrecker to the Shell gas station. During the inventory I found a small zip-lock bag with white powder in the outside pocket of Rooney's purse. The white powder tested positive for cocaine, using a NIC files test kit and weighed 0.7 grams, using a digital scale. Her purse had identifying documents that the purse belonged to Rooney. Rooney was arrested for possession of controlled substance, PG 1, less than a gram.

The vehicle was stored at 9131 Hwy 242.

I transported both Landry and Rooney to Montgomery County CJC. When Landry was getting strip searched to get dressed out into jail clothing, he removed his pants and there was a zip-lock bag with white powder was stuck to his inner left leg. That bag was taken as evidence. While I was inventorying Landry's property, inside his wallet, I found a small zip-lock bag with white powder, a zip-lock bag

with white powder residue, and 7 small zip-lock bags that don't appear to have been used.

After booking both into the jail, I returned to ORNPD. The bag of cocaine Rooney had in her purse was weighed on a triple beam scale at 0.8 grams. The cocaine was placed into the evidence locker. The cocaine that Landry was charged with was weighed together on a triple beam scale, with a total weight of 8.7 grams. The marijuana weighed 14.5 grams. The cocaine and marijuana was placed into the evidence locker.

On 02/21/2018 at approximately 0029 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), while doing routine patrol around Hanna and Robinson, observed a blue Hyundai Sonata, bearing Texas license plate HPV9077, that was traveling northbound on Hanna with the high beams on. The vehicle passed me without dimming the headlights. I turned around as the vehicle went through the second stop sign at Hanna and Robinson. I was able to run the license plate through the MCSO database from my on-board computer. The vehicle came back showing to be stolen out of Harris County and reported on 01/2018. I contacted MCSO Dispatch and advised them that I was behind a possible stolen vehicle and had them confirm the vehicle was stolen. While waiting for the return from MCSO Dispatch, I advised my location as the vehicle turned east onto Chateau Woods Parkway.

While following the vehicle, Officer J. Young (2747) and Sgt. D Barry (2703), both with Oak Ridge North PD, followed behind. Once the vehicle was confirmed to be stolen by MCSO Dispatch, I advised that I was activating my emergency lights as the vehicle came to a stop sign at Chateau Woods Parkway and Fairview. As I activated my emergency lights, the vehicle pulled to the right side of the roadway and stopped. At this time Sgt. Barry, Officer Young, and I conducted a felony stop on the vehicle.

As we gave verbal commands to the driver, he complied and came out of the car. He walked backwards to us, was placed into handcuffs, and was placed in the rear seat of my patrol vehicle. The passenger of the vehicle complied and did the same thing. The passenger was placed into handcuffs and placed into the rear seat of Officer Young's patrol vehicle. Once both subjects were detained, the vehicle was cleared and a first wrecker was called due to the vehicle being a traffic hazard. While waiting for the wrecker to load the vehicle, the male driver

was identified as Steven Swift (B/M; DOB x) and the female passenger was identified as Monique Richardson (B/F; DOB x).

After the wrecker with Rickey's Wrecker Service loaded the vehicle, we moved the scene to Oak Ridge North PD to continue the investigation. Once we arrived at Oak Ridge North PD, I contacted Hertz Rent-a-Car and was able to get hold of customer service. I asked for information about the vehicle being stolen. I was advised that the vehicle was rented by Monique Richardson on 10/30/2017 and was supposed to be returned on 11/15/2017. While I was on the phone with Hertz, Sgt. Barry located a Hertz receipt for Monique. It showed the vehicle to be rented on 10/27/2017 and was supposed to be returned on 11/03/2017. I then had MCSO Dispatch send a copy of the hit confirmation. On the confirmation, I noticed the NIC #V770054869 and VIN # x for this stolen vehicle along with the entering agency being the Harris County Sheriff's Office.

I contacted ADA Dudley and advised him of the incident. He stated that he would not accept charges at this time as there is no knowledge of Hertz sending any paperwork to Monique asking her to return the vehicle or if Monique knew that the insurance company was not paying for the car anymore. I was advised to follow up with Hertz to see if any paperwork could be provided; then we could pursue the charges on Monique.

Once I received this information, I went and removed the handcuffs from both Steven and Monique. I advised them that they would not be going to jail for the stolen vehicle at this time. Steven was able to call a friend and get him to pick them up from the Oak Ridge North PD. The vehicle was towed by Rickey's Wrecker Service to 9131 Hwy 242, Conroe, TX in good condition. The rental company is aware of the tow location.

A copy of this report has been sent to MCSO Dispatch to have the vehicle removed as stolen from TCIC/NCIC on 02/21/2018 at approximately 0245 hours.

On 02/23/2018 at approximately 1750 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), arrived at work for the beginning of my shift. I noticed a vehicle record file from the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office Communications. The record was for the removal of the vehicle from TIC/NIC. Operator Ortiz (Z1004) removed the vehicle

at approximately 0042 hours on 02/21/2018, using TIC # TV2261580345, and NIC # V770054869.

On 02/21/2018 at approximately 1215 hours I, Officer Duenas, riding with Officer Teske, was advised of a fraud call at the ORNPD, located at 27424 Robinson Road. I arrived on location and met with a female, who identified herself by TX DL # x as Diana Farr Smith, w/f, dob x. Smith resides at x Kane Lane. Smith advised that she wanted to file a report due to fraud. While speaking with Smith she advised that the incident started on 02/13/2018. She advised that she received a phone call from xxxxxxxx and the person identified herself as Debra Holland with the Publishers Clearing House. Smith advised that Holland told her she could possibly win the Publishers Clearing House grand prize, which is a new Mercedes Benz. Smith provided Holland with her TX DL # x and her husband's TX DL # x. Publishers Clearing House sent her an e-mail shortly after the phone call with proof that she was a winner and with steps to help her receive money and the new car. Smith was advised that they would pay off all of her credit cards and they provided her with bank account numbers she could use to pay off the balances on all of her credit cards. Using the information the caller provided, she made payments to her credit card companies and received confirmation from American Express, Visa, and two of her Discover Cards; showing that her credit cards were paid off. She made a payment in the amount of \$30,660.93 to America Express, \$23,164.61 to Visa, and \$8,886.23 to Discover. She then received an e-mail informing her to send a certified check for \$11,000.00 to a Leon Ellis. She was also provided with an account # x and routing #x, where she could have the money wired. After Smith was advised to wire the money into the account, she realized this may be a scam. She also received an e-mail from American Express on 02/21/2018 informing her that there were not enough funds in the bank account she used to try and pay off her account. Smith contacted all of her credit card companies and determined that none of her balances were paid off. She then cancelled all of her credit cards.

At this time, Smith has not suffered any monetary losses as a result of this incident. It is unknown at this time if her personal information or her husband's personal information has been used for any nefarious purposes. At this time, this report is being taken for information purposes. Smith provided me with printouts

of payment confirmations and e-mails from "Publishers Clearinghouse". The copies were turned in with this report.

On 02/19/2018 at about 0106 hours I, Officer H. Richard, was patrolling south on Harlan and Laura, when I observed a grey passenger car parked backwards facing south, at the end of the driveway, at 323 Laura Ln occupied by two white females. The vehicle was not running. While making contact with the driver, I smelled a strong odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The driver was identified as Stacy Thompson, DOB x, white female. The front right passenger was identified as Angela Fannin, DOB x, white female.

While speaking with both subjects, Thompson and Fannin, I observed a white male approaching me from behind a vehicle parked at the above address. While asking the male to come to me, he went behind the vehicle again and that is when I heard a wrapper or baggie, either being thrown behind the vehicle or placed in his pocket. The male was identified by his name and date of birth as Mathew William Tolar DOB, x, white male. I asked Tolar what he was doing at this address. Tolar stated that he was talking with a friend named Patrick, later identified as Patrick Zagar, DOB x, white male (see supplement) that lives there. I asked Tolar if he had anything in his pockets and Tolar stated, "No just a phone." I patted Tolar down for any weapons for officer safety. I asked what was in his front right pocket. I asked Tolar if he could empty out his pockets and Tolar willingly took out a cell phone, a lighter, and what it appears to be an edible rice crispy treat. As I placed the edible treat on the vehicle, I smelled a strong odor of marijuana. I detained Tolar at that time for further investigation. I tested the edible treat with a (E) NIK TEST KIT and it showed positive for marijuana. I looked in the back seat where Tolar stated he was sitting and found two more edible marijuana rice crispy treats that also tested positive for marijuana.

I searched the vehicle and found a black Taurus, model: 740 Slim; caliber: .40 S&W; serial #: SHW20721 hand gun with one 40 cal Smith and Wesson bullet in the chamber and a loaded magazine with 14 bullets. I asked Montgomery County dispatched to check the gun for stolen and MCSO dispatched advised the gun was not stolen.

Thompson, Fannin and Tolar stated they did not have knowledge of the gun being in the vehicle. Thompson stated that she let her daughter's boyfriend use the vehicle and it could have been his.

While talking with Tolar he stated that Thompson handed him all three edible treats prior of my arrival. Tolar stated Thompson bakes the edible treats and she offered him one. ADA Dudley did not accept charges on Thompson for PCS. Tolar was transported to MCSO for UCW.

On 02/21/2018 at approximately 1548 hours I, Officer Duenas, riding with Officer Teske, was traveling in the 27700 block of Robinson Rd. I observed a grey Nissan Sentra and a white Jeep Cherokee stopped in the middle of the road with their hazard lights on. I made contact with the driver of the grey Nissan Sentra, displaying TX LP # BHM8071, who identified herself by TX DL # x as Jocelyn Galvez, w/f, dob x. Galvez advised me that she and the white Jeep Cherokee, displaying TX LP # JSD4363, were involved in a motor vehicle accident. I made contact with the driver of the white Jeep Cherokee, who identified herself by TX DL # as Danielle Roselyne Scibek, w/f, dob x. Scibek advised me that Galvez hit her from behind. Galvez admitted to driving too fast, causing her to strike the back end of Scibek's vehicle.

Scibek also had a passenger who was sitting in the front right passenger seat, who identified himself by TX DL # x as Adrain Gomez, w/m, dob x. A check through my MDT and MCSO showed Gomez to have an open warrant through Montgomery County CCL #4. I advised MCSO Dispatch to confirm the warrant. MCSO Dispatch confirmed the warrant and I placed Gomez in custody for Warrant # 16-314162 for Possession of Marijuana (Capias).

The crash report was filed under case # 18P001352. The grey Nissan Sentra was towed by Rickey's Wrecker Service to 27718 Robinson Rd. I then transported Gomez to MCSO Jail for booking.

On Wednesday 02/21/2018 at approximately 2214 hours, I, Officer Valdez was running traffic with my Pro Laser Lidar on the 26800 IH 45 South Feeder. I

observed a black Jeep vehicle displaying paper plate #04C4981 drive by me at a high rate of speed. A return on my Lidar gun showed the vehicle to be going 80 MPH on a 45 MPH zone. I then turned on my red and blue emergency lights and attempted to make a traffic stop near the 26300 block of the IH 45 South Feeder, but the vehicle failed to yield. The driver of the vehicle continued to drive and made a U turn on Sawdust, and onto the IH 45 North Feeder near the 25100 block. The driver of the vehicle then turned right (east bound) onto the businesses located on the 25100 block of the IH 45 North Feeder, drove through the businesses and then turned left (north bound) onto Brookhaven Dr. The driver then drove until Rayford Forest Dr and turned right (east bound) on Rayford Forest Dr, I then pursued until Oakhurst and the driver turned right (south bound). The driver continued on, on Oakhurst until we got to Rayford Rd and turned right (west bound) and continued until he got to the Shell gas station located at 25103 and drove into the gas station. The driver drove around the Shell gas station in circles as I pursued him a total of two times, he then exited the gas station towards the IH 45 North Feeder and I pursued him on the feeder road. By this time MCSO 2 Dispatch was advised by, I, Officer Valdez about the pursuit and channel was closed. The vehicle continued on at speeds of 90 MPH on the IH 45 North Feeder road. The driver then merged onto the IH 45 North main lanes and continued to evade on the main lanes at speeds of 100 MPH. The vehicle exited the main lanes at exit 77 and drove towards Lake Woodlands. I continued to pursue at speeds of 100 MPH and the vehicle then took the entrance ramp and merged back onto the IH 45 North main lanes near Research Forest by the 19400 block. The vehicle continued to evade on the IH 45 North main lanes and then took the 242 West exit fly over. The driver wrecked out and came to a stop shortly after when he lost control of the vehicle and hit barriers on both sides of the fly over. I then brought my patrol vehicle to a stop and at gun point ordered the driver to get out of the vehicle and get on the ground. As I approached the vehicle several units followed with me. The driver of the vehicle who was identified by TX ID #x, as Christopher Mattew Daniels, B/M, DOB x, was cooperative and laid flat on the ground, cuffs were put on him and he was placed in custody. There was also a passenger in the vehicle who was the brother of the driver, he was identified by Alabama DL #x, as Michael Andrew Jones, B/M, DOB x. Jones was also held at gun point and then instructed to exit the vehicle, he was then cuffed and placed in custody as well.

Daniels and Jones were both Mirandized after they were both placed in custody. Both the driver, Daniels, and the passenger, Jones, were searched and a green leafy substance was found on Daniels person in a clear plastic bag. A NIK test showed the green leafy substance to be Marijuana, the Marijuana was also weighed and the weight came out to 5.5 grams. Jones was searched as well but nothing was found on him. Both subjects were then ran through MCSO 2 Dispatch. The return for Jones came back clear, but the driver Daniels showed to have warrants out of the ORNPD. Officer Henry ( 2722) aired for a wrecker to tow the vehicle to a separate location, and he also advised dispatch to have EMS check by as well to make sure both Daniels and Jones were well after the crash.

The vehicle used in the pursuit was towed to the Taco Cabana parking lot located at 3079 College Park, where we relocated to get off of the flyover and onto a safer location. At the Taco Cabana Daniels advised that he was at a sisters birthday party with his brother the Jones, and that he had been smoking Marijuana and he also admitted to having a few drinks. Jones also admitted to having a few drinks but stated that he was asleep the entire pursuit and did not know what was happening, that was confirmed by Daniels who advised that Jones was asleep the entire time and had no knowledge of what was happening. I asked Daniels why he evaded, he advised that he smoked weed, had a few drinks, his mom had just died recently and his license was invalid, so he decided to try and get away. EMS (Medic 20) checked both Daniels and Jones for injuries, and aside from a leg bruise on Daniels both subjects were cleared by EMS. Officer Henry then searched the vehicle while I conducted SFST's on Daniels. I placed Daniels in front of my patrol vehicle so that my dash camera could record me conducting SFST's. I began with the HGN test but did not find enough clues. I instructed Daniels on how to perform the one legged stand, he did the test, but I got no clues. I instructed Daniels on how to do the walk and turn test, he did it and I found no clues as well. Daniels eyes were slightly red, but he was coherent did not slur his words and he had control of all oh his body functions. After conducting SFST's I felt that Daniels was not intoxicated. Daniels was then placed in the back of my patrol vehicle and Jones was released from the scene on foot because there was nothing to charge him with and he had no knowledge of his brother evading. I advised MCSO 2 Dispatch that I would be returning to the ORNPD to confirm warrants on Daniels, so I drove to the ORNPD and pulled two hard copies for the following:

#421923 01 - Driving While License Invalid - fine \$294.00.

#421923F 01 - Failure To Appear/Bail Jumping - fine \$289.00.

After confirming the warrants at the ORNPD I transported Daniels to Conroe Jail for male booking at 2329 hours, I attempted to book him in but I was advised by the nurse at the jail that I had to get Daniels medically cleared at a hospital since he was involved in an accident. At approximately 0111 hours I transported Daniels to Conroe Regional Hospital and got him medically cleared at approximately 0306 hours. I then transported Daniels back to Conroe Jail. I completed all of my paper work and finished booking Daniels in at approximately 0340 hours.

Daniels was booked in and charged with Evading arrest with a motor vehicle, and he was also charged with Possession of Marijuana < 2OZ. The warrants out of the ORNPD were also served to Daniels.

Daniels vehicle was towed from the Taco Cabana parking lot by South County Wrecker to 28075 Robinson Rd by chip #24.

From start to finish the pursuit lasted approximately 8 miles.

Copies of the warrants will be left on Sgt. Nations door for further review. The sid # for the warrants is 06607852.

Booking paper work along with the tow slip will be turned to the ORNPD for further review. The marijuana that Daniels was charged for will also be turned into the ORNPD evidence locker.

On 02/24/2018 at approximately 2357 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), while doing routine patrol in the area of Woodson and Hanna, observed a gray Mazda pickup, bearing Texas license plate BYZ3990, that was traveling eastbound on Woodson from the Hanna intersection. I ran the license plate as the vehicle passed my location and I discovered that the registration was expired as of 04/2015. I was able to catch up to the vehicle as it turned eastbound on Sleepy Hollow from Main.

I activated my emergency lights and stopped the vehicle at Sleepy Hollow and Pine Haven. I exited my patrol vehicle and made contact with Donald Keith Wigglesworth (W/M; DOB x) from his verbal statement. While speaking with Donald, he stated that he didn't have his license and didn't have any insurance on the vehicle that he was driving. I returned to my patrol vehicle and discovered that Donald had an active warrant out of the Navarro County Sheriff's Office for DWI, with a child < 15.

I had MCSO Dispatch confirm the warrant. While waiting for the warrant to be confirmed, I issued Donald an Oak Ridge North citation #1100498 for Display Expired License Plates, Driving While License Invalid, and Fail to Maintain Financial Responsibility. Upon completing the citation, MCSO Dispatch notified me that the warrant was confirmed. I had Donald exit the vehicle and placed him under arrest.

Donald's vehicle was then towed by CFM Towing, chip # 53, to 6317 Big Oaks in fair condition. Donald is aware of the tow location

On 02-26-2018 at approximately 0845 hours I, Officer Helton, was dispatched to a Theft Past, at 27250 Kane Ln, the reportee called the Oak Ridge North Police Department and advised that the Theft took place on the evening of 02-25-2018 and he just noticed that the Theft happened, when he arrived at work. The reportee came to the Police Department to complete the report. The reportee was identified as Isaac Christlieb white male date of birth x. Christlieb said that he arrived home at approximately 1000 hours on 02-25-2018 and parked the truck bearing Texas license plate number FJT5272, then went inside for the night. This morning 02-26-2018 Christlieb said that he went to check on his store, and stopped to get fuel, before going to the store and noticed that his LED light bar was missing from his front bumper and that the wire that gave the light bar power was cut. Christlieb said that the light bar was estimated at the cost of \$768.00 for the light bar and installation of the light bar. I asked Christlieb, if there was a serial number for the light bar and Christlieb said that he did not have a serial number for the light bar. When I went to Christlieb's house, I did not

observe any security cameras on his house or his neighbor's houses. I gave Christlieb a case number for the Theft.

I asked Christlieb if he would give a voluntary statement about the incident and he consented. Statement reads.

" I got home yesterday around 10 AM and the light bar was on the truck. When I was pumping gas this morning. The light bar was missing. This was at 8:30 AM at HEB 99 & Rayford Road. The light bar was a KC LED 30" bar. Part # 336 with 2 rows of LED lights."

On 02/26/2018 at about 2214 hours I, Officer H. Richard was dispatched by Montgomery County to a suspicious vehicle call at 28256 Nancy lane. The notes stated, the reportee advised there was a strange truck that she never seen before on her street and that she was scared. I arrived on scene and met with the reportee. The reportee was identified as Amy Fisher , DOB x, white female. Fisher stated that she thought there was someone in her vehicle and she wanted her sister to take her to the hospital. Her sister was identified as Sarah Margie Dieson, DOB x, white female. I checked the white expedition that was parked outside of her house and advised Fisher there was no one in the truck. Fisher and Dieson got into the expedition and drove off.
