

POLICE ACTIVITY REPORT NOV 13 TO NOV 27

On 11-13-2018 at approximately 1903 hours I, Officer Young, responded to a welfare check at Jason Ct/ Oak Hill. Dispatch advised that a female was walking and found a male in the ditch near the roadway. I arrived on scene and observed a male laying in the grassy area next to the roadway. The male was identified as James Patty (W/M; DOB xxxxxx). James was laying on the ground unconscious and his breathing was labored. I also observed that James was foaming at the mouth and was sweating. The temperature at the time of the call was 37 degrees Fahrenheit. Officer Richard and I both applied sternum rubs to elicit a response from James but got no reaction from James on either attempt.

The reportee was identified as Linette Holmes (W/F; DOB xxxxxx). I asked Linette if she knew James. At first she denied that she knew him. After further questioning, I found out that her boyfriend knew James and they were hanging out prior to James collapsing from an apparent overdose. Linette told us which house her boyfriend was located at. Officer Richard walked to 26715 Oak Hill Drive and made contact with the boyfriend who was identified as Justin Phelps (W/M; DOB xxxxxxxx). Officer Richard confirmed that Justin and James were just together. Justin advised that they were dropped off from doing heroin in the mall parking lot 20 minutes before the call came into Dispatch. Justin advised that James had also taken a couple Xanax pills while in the car. Justin stated that a female named Chelsea was driving the vehicle but gave not other descriptors or information about the vehicle's make or model. Both Justin and Linette provided me with voluntary written statements.

Justin Phelps statement:

"I saw Jimmy snort Heroin in the vehicle and we got Dropped off in front of my house. then he went for a walk and my girl Linette Holmes went to find him and she found him passed out in the ditch a street down then called 911"

Linette Holmes statement:

"I was walking outside and saw my boyfriends friend unconscious laying on the side of Jason Ct in Oakridge North and called 911 and followed their instructions."

Both voluntary statements will be turned in with this report. James was transported by EMS to Memorial Hermann Hospital. All Oak Ridge North Units returned to service.

**On 11/14/2018 at approximately 0102 hours Trooper Sonnier stopped a Nissan Xterra (TX LP # xxxxxxx) for no LP light at FM 1488 and Mansion Dr. Trooper Sonnier made contact with the driver, who identified himself as Tony Zuma (W/M; DOB xxxxxxx). Zuma showed to have warrants out of the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. Trooper Sonnier asked the ORN Police to confirm the warrants. I, Officer Durham, found two active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrants for the following:
Warrant #110065401 - Expired Registration - Fine \$166.00
Warrant #1100654F01 - Failure to Appear / Bail Jumping - Fine \$348.00
Total Fine Amount: \$514.00**

Trooper Sonnier had the Nissan towed after I confirmed the warrants. I arrived at FM 1488 and Mansion Dr. at 0113 hours. Zuma was in Trooper Sonnier's patrol vehicle. I took custody of Zuma and asked him if he could pay the total fine amount of \$514.00. Zuma stated he could not pay the total fine amount at that time. Zuma was arrested and transported to the MCSO South County Jail where he was booked. I advised Sgt. Nation of the arrest.

On 11/16/2018 at approximately 2230 hours I, Officer Young, was dispatched to a burglary of a motor vehicle at 27000 IH-45 N Feeder, in the parking lot of Bowlero on the south side of the building. I arrived on scene and observed a white Chevrolet Silverado, displaying TX LP # xxxxxx, with the front passenger window busted out. I then made contact with the owner of the vehicle, who was identified by TX DL # xxxxxxx as Matthew McGlone (W/M; DOB xxxxxxx). Matthew stated that he arrived at Bowlero around 8:30 pm. Matthew came out to his

truck at 10:30 pm and noticed that the window had been broken. Matthew also advised that after he called the Police, he opened the passenger door to see if anything was missing. Matthew advised that there was nothing of value in his truck and that nothing had been taken.

I spoke to the manager of Bowlero, who was identified as Mark Henderson (B/M; DOB xxxxxx). Mark was able to pull up the camera on the exterior of the building on the southeast corner. At 9:11 pm, I observed on the camera, a dark colored 4 door sedan back into the space next to the passenger door of Matthew's truck. An unknown individual exited the vehicle and struck the passenger door window of Matthew's truck causing it to break and the truck's alarm went off. Once the alarm went off, the suspect got back into passenger side of the sedan and the vehicle pulled out of the parking space. From the video footage, I was unable to identify the make or model or see the license plate on the vehicle. I was also unable to see the physical descriptors of the actor that caused the damage to Matthew's truck. I checked multiple cameras around the building but was unable to gain any further information on the actors or actor vehicle.

Mark stated that he would contact his loss prevention and get approval to make a copy of the video footage. Once Mark makes a copy of the footage, he will contact the Oak Ridge North PD to pick it up. The total cost to replace the passenger door window was \$175.00.

While on patrol at approx. 2130 hours on 11-16-2018 I, Sgt. Barry, saw a white 2005 Dodge Durango, bearing Texas license plate xxxxxx. The vehicle was northbound in the 27200 block of the IH-45 E. Feeder Road. I ran the license plate on my MDC and it showed to have an expired motor vehicle registration, Feb. 2018, with no vehicle insurance coverage found. I stopped the vehicle and the driver identified herself as Casondra Denise Letney (w/f; dob xxxxxx). Letney stated that she did not have insurance on the vehicle. I asked if she had anything with her name on it and she stated she did not. I ran the name and date of birth she gave me and found a Texas driver's

license, #xxxxxxx. This driver's license gave Letney's physical description as a white female, 5'07, 190 lbs, red hair, and green eyes. I did not believe that matched the driver. I also noticed that she spelled the middle name Denise but the driver's license had the middle name spelled with two N's, Dennise. I asked the driver to exit the vehicle. I asked her again what her name was. She gave the same name. I advised that she does not have red hair and she is not 5'07".

While standing outside the vehicle, I saw paperwork on the front dashboard that had the name of Tasha Letney. I ran that name and I found a Texas ID card, #xxxxxx, that returned to Tasha Mae Letney (w/f; dob xxxxxx) with a physical description of brown hair, blue eyes, 5'01", and 210 lbs. This description matched the driver. The Tasha Letney name showed two outstanding warrants. The first warrant, #21182, is out of Polk County, Judge Tom Brown, for 3rd MTAG possession of a controlled substance, phencyclidine. The second warrant, #F17-0693-2, is out of Angelina County for man del cs pg. There was no court listed on the second warrant. Both warrants were confirmed. I arrested Tasha Letney. After she was handcuffed, she stated that her real name was Tasha Letney. The vehicle was towed by Loveday Towing and stored at 28075 Robinson Road. Letney was transported to the Montgomery County Jail and booked.

The ADA did not want to accept the fail to identify - fugitive from justice, so Montgomery County can release her to the county's that have felony charges on her.

On 11/17/2018 at approximately 0345 hours, Deputy Burkett (2P1019) was notified by MCSO Dispatch of a black Dodge truck (TX LP xxxxx) that jumped a curb at the Shell Station, located at 25103 I-45. Deputy Burkett made contact with the driver, who identified herself as Coral Bossow (W/F; DOB xxxxx). Bossow showed to have local warrants out of Montgomery County Court and the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. Deputy Burkett asked ORN Police to confirm the ORN warrants. I, Officer Durham, found one active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrant for the following:

Warrant #805692F01 - Failure to Appear / Bail Jumping - Fine \$424.10 Total Fine Amount: \$424.10 Deputy Burkett had the Dodge towed before I confirmed the warrants. I arrived at 25103 I-45 at 0420 hours. Bossow was in Deputy Burkett's patrol vehicle. Bossow was unable to pay for the warrant. Bossow was arrested and transported to the MCSO Jail by Deputy Burkett, where she was booked in on all warrants. I advised Sgt. Nation of the arrest.

On 11/17/2018 at approximately 2304 hours I, Officer Durham (Unit 2728), was traveling N/B in the 27600 block of the IH 45 N Feeder. I observed a blue Nissan Sentra, bearing Texas license plate #xxxxxx. A search on my MDT revealed that the Nissan's insurance was unconfirmed; last match not within 45 days. I activated my emergency lights and stopped the vehicle in the 19099 block of the IH 45 North Feeder. My investigation revealed the following.

I observed one occupant in the Sentra. The driver identified himself as Bayron Lopez (H/M; DOB xxxxxx) by his TX ID #xxxxxx. I asked for his driver's license and insurance information. Lopez stated he did not have proof of insurance or a driver's license.

A search on my MDT revealed Lopez had a TX DL #xxxxxx and it showed to be Not Eligible - Expired.

I advised MCSO Dispatch and asked for a fifteen-minute wrecker call, due to the Nissan having no insurance and Lopez not having a valid DL. While waiting for the time to expire, I issued Lopez an Oak Ridge North citation #169628 for Driving While License Invalid and Fail to Maintain Financial Responsibility.

The Nissan was towed by Milstead Towing to 29707 W. Hawthorne in poor condition.

Lopez was released on foot from the scene.

On 11/17/2018 at approximately 0238 hours I, Officer Durham (Unit 2728), was stationary on the Woodlands Pkwy SE Loop. I observed a silver Ford Focus, bearing Texas license plate #xxxxxx. A search on my MDT revealed that the Ford's insurance was unconfirmed; last match not within 45 days. I activated my emergency lights and stopped the vehicle in the 27900 block of the IH 45 North Feeder. My investigation revealed the following.

I observed one occupant in the Ford. The driver identified herself as Gabriela Hernandez (H/F; DOB xxxxxx) by her TX ID #xxxxx. I asked for her driver's license and insurance information. Hernandez did not have proof of insurance or a driver's license.

A search on my MDT revealed Hernandez had a TX DL, #xxxxxx, and it showed to be Not Eligible - Expired. My MDT also revealed that Hernandez had two local warrants from MCSO for speeding and DWLI. MCSO Dispatch was able to confirm the warrants (Warrant #1CC6972 and #1CC6973). Hernandez was arrested and placed in my patrol car. I asked MCSO Dispatch for a fifteen-minute ORN wrecker call. While waiting for the time to expire, I issued Hernandez an Oak Ridge North citation, #169629, for Driving While License Invalid and Fail to Maintain Financial Responsibility.

The Ford was towed by Steven's Towing to 18901 Main Street in poor condition.

Hernandez was transported to the MCSO Jail for booking without incident.

On 11-17-2018 at approx. 1520 Hours, I, Officer R. E. Craig III, was dispatched a THEFT past, at Arlan's Market, located at 26824 I-45 N, Oak Ridge North, Texas 77385. When I arrived on scene, I met with the reportee Karol Medina, who is the store manager. Medina advised me that an UNKNOWN black male had just entered the store, walked to the front service desk, and asked the booth attendant if she could change some bills for a single one-hundred-dollar bill.

The booth attendant was identified as Kaedance Wilcox, white female, date of birth xxxxx, who will be listed as a witness in the report.

Wilcox stated to me the UNKNOWN male handed her 4 \$20.00 bills, 1

\$10.00 bill and 2 \$5.00 bills. Wilcox took the money and counted it out, then pulled a single \$100.00 bill out of her register, handed it to the UNKNOWN male. The UNKNOWN male then immediately told her that she had only given him a \$10.00 bill instead of the \$100.00 bill that he wanted. She thought she had made a mistake in giving the change, so she took the \$10.00 from him and gave him a single \$100.00 bill. The male then left the store.

After the UNKNOWN male left, Wilcox thought that she may have been a victim to a Quick-Change artist. She then contacted the store manager Karol Medina, so Medina could count the courtesy booth register. Once the register was counted, they confirmed the register was indeed short by \$90.00. This is when they called for Police assistance.

I asked if they had video of the subject while he was standing at the counter. Medina stated they should be able to see him on the camera, but she would have to check. I also asked her to check the cameras outside to see if we could see a vehicle, that may help us identify the UNKNOWN black male. I asked Wilcox to describe the male. She identified him as a fairly young male probably in his mid-20's, maybe 5'10" 6'00" tall, about 150 lbs. This male was wearing black jeans, black hoodie, and a black beanie.

I advised Medina that once she is able to review the video, to make a copy of it for me. Depending on what she is able to see on the video would determine how we would proceed with this report.

On 11-18-2018 at approximately 1030 Hours, Karol Medina, called me and advised she had a copy of the video ready for me to pick up at Arlan's. I met with Medina at Arlan's and she showed me the video. The video shows the UNKNOWN male arriving at the store in a black Pontiac 4 door. The UNKNOWN male was the driver and it appears there may have been a passenger in the front passenger seat. The unknown male gets out, walks straight to the courtesy booth, and proceeds to ask for his change. While he is at the counter, you can see him give his money to the booth attendant Wilcox. Wilcox then gives him the money from the register. It appears the male takes the money with his right hand and then hands the booth attendant a bill with his left hand. This is when the UNKNOWN male stated she had given him the wrong change.

This entire money exchange only took about 2 or 3 minutes. The male then walked out of the store and got into the driver's seat of the black Pontiac passenger car. The vehicle left to the north from the parking lot.

I took the CD which contained that footage of the UNKNOWN male when he arrived at the store and while he was in the store. The clarity of the video is not good enough for me to read the license plate displayed on the front of the vehicle the UNKNOWN male was driving. The CD has been placed into the evidence locker at the Oak Ridge North Police Department. Detective B. Rogers was notified of the theft.

On 11-19-2018 Montgomery County Dispatch asked Oak Ridge North to confirm warrants on Hector Deras Fuentes (w/m; dob xxxxxx). I, Sgt. Barry, found one active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrant for Capias Pro Fine - warrant #251946F01, fine \$447.20. Dispatch advised Deras Fuentes was at the Montgomery County Jail being booked in on unauthorized use of a motor vehicle. I arrived at the jail at 0230 hours and met Montgomery County Pct. 2 Deputy Constable J. Torres, Unit #8217. Deputy Torres was booking Deras Fuentes into the jail. Deputy Torres executed the Oak Ridge North warrant and added the warrant to Deras Fuentes' arrest record. I returned to service. Sgt. Nation was advised.

On 11/20/2018 at approximately 0018 hours, DPS Trooper Sonnier stopped a Chevy Silverado (KY LP # xxxxxxx) for speeding at 9250 Pinecroft Dr. Trooper Sonnier made contact with the driver, who identified himself as Andrew Young (W/M; DOB xxxxxxx). Young showed to have warrants out of the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. Trooper Sonnier asked ORN Police to confirm the warrants. I, Officer

Durham, found two active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrants for the following:

Warrant #1690082301 - Speeding - Fine \$282.00

Warrant #16900823F1 - Failure to Appear / Bail Jumping - Fine \$318.00

Total Fine Amount: \$600.00

Trooper Sonnier had the Silverado towed after I confirmed the warrants. I arrived at 9250 Pinecroft Dr. at 0035 hours. Young was in Trooper Sonnier's patrol vehicle. I took custody of Young and asked him if he could pay the total fine amount of \$600.00. Young stated he could not pay the total fine amount at that time.

Young was arrested and transported to the MCSO South County Jail, where he was booked. I advised Sgt. Nation of the arrest.

On 11/21/2018 at approximately 0125 hours Officer Thompson (1617) stopped a Honda Accord (TX LP # xxxx) for no insurance and fail to maintain single lane at the 20400 block of Eva Road. Officer Thompson made contact with the driver, who identified herself as Patricia David (B/F; DOB xxxxxxxx). David showed to have warrants out of Oak Ridge North Municipal Court. Officer Thompson asked ORN Police to confirm the warrants. I, Officer Durham, found four active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrants for the following:

Warrant #4148902 - No Proof of Financial Responsibility - Fine \$468.00

Warrant #4148903 - Fail to Display Driver's License- Fine \$209.00

Total Fine Amount: \$1,339.00

Officer Thompson asked that the warrants be sent to female booking at MCSO Jail. Officer Thompson arrested Patricia and transported her to the MCSO South County Jail where she was booked. I delivered the ORNPD warrants to Officer Thompson at the MCSO Jail. I advised Sgt. Nation of the arrest.

On 11/21/18 at approximately 1308 hours I, Officer Kennerly, was dispatched to a motor vehicle crash, located at 26514 Interstate 45 North Feeder Road. Upon my arrival, I met with Unit 3 driver, Darlene Drew, white female, date of birth xxxxxx. Drew advised me she was hit from behind. I then met with Unit 2 Driver, Yungning Chen, Asian male, date of birth xxxxxxx. Chen advised me that his vehicle, a black Toyota Camry, bearing Texas license plate xxxxxxx, was struck from behind by a white full size van, Unit 1. That impact caused Chen's vehicle to strike Drew's vehicle, a white GMC Terrain, bearing Texas license plate xxxxxxx from behind. Chen advised the white van fled the scene and that was the only description he could give involving Unit 1. There was fresh damage to the back end of Chen's vehicle, indicating it had been struck from behind. Drew was unaware that there was another vehicle involved. Both Unit 2 and Unit 3 vehicles sustained well over \$200.00 worth of damage.

On 11-21-2018 at approx. 1830 hours I, Sgt. Barry, took custody of Jeremiah Jones (b/m; dob xxxxxxx) at the Harris County Jail, 1201 Commerce Street, Houston, Texas. Jones had three active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrants for: expired registration - warrant #89082901, fine \$266.00; defective equipment - warrant #89082902, fine \$271.00; and failure to appear/bail jumping - warrant #890829F01, fine \$348.00. The total fine amount was \$885.00. Jones advised that he could not make restitution. I transported Jones to the South Montgomery County Jail where he was booked in. Sgt. Nation was advised of the arrest.

On 11/23/2018 at approximately 1235 hours I, Officer Stafford (Unit 2723), was dispatched for a warrant service to confirm warrants on Jesse Shepard Jr., B/M, DOB xxxxxxx. After arriving at the PD, I located three active ORN warrants on Jesse. The warrants were for Driving While License Invalid - #4113101, fine \$326.00; Expired

Registration - #4113102, fine \$266.00; and Failure to Appear - #41131F01, fine \$348.00. The total fine amount for the active warrants is \$940.00. After locating the warrants, I met Trooper Chavez (2P905) at Woodlands Parkway and Gosling Road. I asked Jesse if he was able to pay the fines and he stated that he could not. I placed Jesse under arrest and transported him to the MCSO South County jail without incident.

On 11-23-2018 at approximately 1702 hours I, Officer Teske, received a call on the Oak Ridge North PD after hours phone in reference to a burglary of a motor vehicle past call. The reportee, Vincent Nguyen (A/M; DOB xxxxxx), advised that his vehicle was burglarized while he was at Office Depot, located at 27500 IH 45 North. I arrived on scene shortly thereafter and met with Vincent and Harry Nguyen (A/M; DOB xxxxxx). Vincent and Harry were standing next to a red 2004 Jaguar XJ8, displaying Florida LP# xxxxxx. I observed the front passenger window of the Jaguar was broken out. Vincent advised that he arrived at Office Depot at approximately 1400 hours and noticed his vehicle window was shattered when he came back out at approximately 1420 hours. Vincent advised that he did not see anything missing from the vehicle, at that time, and was not going to file a report so he left the scene. He went back to his business on Lake Woodlands Drive and met with Harry, who he picked up from the airport earlier this morning. Harry told Vincent that his backpack was missing from the front passenger seat of the Jaguar. Vincent advised that he then returned to Office Depot to file a report. I observed there was no glass on the ground next to the Jaguar and Vincent advised that he was parked several spaces south of our current location. He then showed me shattered glass that was on the ground. The estimated cost to replace the window is \$325.00.

**Harry advised the following was stolen from the vehicle:
Navy blue Jansport backpack (Approximate value \$35.00).
Silver Macbook Pro with black hardcover case. The hardcover case had "Go Pro" and "Beats by Dre" stickers displayed. (Approximate value \$900.00).
Black Beats by Dre Headphones (Approximate value \$300.00).**

White Iphone 7 smart phone (Approximate value \$500.00).

U.S. Passport issued to Harry Nguyen (Approximate value \$110.00).

Illinois birth certificate issued to Harry Nguyen (Approximate value \$15.00).

The total value of all stolen items was \$1,860.00.

Harry advised that he did not have model or serial numbers for any of the stolen items and did not believe that he would be able to find them.

I took three pictures of the Jaguar that were downloaded to the server at the ORNPD.

Because the vehicle had been moved and several hours had passed since the alleged burglary, and because Vincent and Harry had since touched the vehicle, there was nothing of evidentiary value left in or on the vehicle. At this time the suspect(s) in the offense is unknown. There are no cameras that record the parking lot at Office Depot.

On 11/24/2018 at approximately 2149 hours Officer White (HPD) made contact with Herbert Toliver (W/M; DOB xxxxxx). Toliver showed to have warrants out of the Oak Ridge North Municipal Court and warrants out of Houston. Officer White called the ORN Police patrol phone to confirm the warrants. I, Officer Durham, found three active Oak Ridge North Municipal Court warrant for the following:

Warrant #42334802 - Defective Equipment- Fine \$271.00

Warrant #423348F01 - Failure to Appear / Bail Jumping - Fine \$348.00

Total Fine Amount: \$945.00

Officer White asked that I fax the warrants to him. I faxed the warrants to Officer White and received the fax machine confirmation page.

Toliver was arrested and transported to the HCSO Jail by Officer White where he was booked. I advised Sgt. Nation of the arrest.

On 11-25-2018 at approximately 1648 hours I, Officer Teske, was advised by MCSO Dispatch of a burglary of a motor vehicle past call at Kanga's Indoor Play Center. Kanga's Indoor Play Center is located at 26803 Hanna Road, Building 6, Suites 601 - 604. I arrived on location and met with the reportee, identified by TDL# xxxxxx as Xochiquetzal Franko (W/F; DOB: xxxxxxx). Mrs. Franko advised that she parked her vehicle on the east side of the business at approximately 1430 hours. When she came back outside at 1639 hours, she observed the front windshield to her vehicle was smashed and her purse was stolen from the front floorboard. I observed her vehicle, a black 2017 Dodge caravan, displaying TX LP # xxxxxx, parked on the east side of the building. I observed the front passenger windshield was smashed and there was glass inside the vehicle and on the ground outside the vehicle. Mrs. Franko advised the following was stolen from the vehicle:

1 - Brown Michael Kohrs cross body purse, valued at approximately \$200.00.

1 - Tan wallet, valued at approximately \$20.00.

1 - Prescription bottle with four (4) Tramadol tablets.

2 - Prescription bottles with unknown antibiotics.

1 - Woodforest Bank debit card (unknown number).

3 - Capital One credit/debit cards (unknown numbers).

Miscellaneous items (ex. pens, tweezers).

The total value of stolen items was approximately \$220.00.

The cost to replace the broken passenger window is estimated at \$270.00.

I did not see any items of evidence left at the scene or on the vehicle.

At this time the suspect(s) in the offense is unknown.
